




#### **Choral Introduction**



# Gospel Matthew 1:18-25 Matthew's story of Jesus' birth focuses on the role of Joseph, who adopts the divinely-begotten child into the family of David and obediently gives him the name Jesus, which means "God saves."

<sup>18</sup>Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. <sup>19</sup>Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. <sup>20</sup>But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. <sup>21</sup>She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." <sup>22</sup>All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: <sup>23</sup>"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they

Today's Prelude, Offertory, and Postlude, all use the same hymn tune, *IRBY*, as the theme upon which the arrangement is made. These three composers were all born after 1950, making them approximately the same age, and they currently compose and edit for Augsburg Fortress. It is interesting the variety of settings of this well known hymn. The words for "Once in Royal David's City" were written by Cecil Frances Humphreys Alexander, the wife of the Archbishop of Armaugh, in Ireland. Mrs. Alexander also penned over 400 hymns and poems. Other hymns that you will recognize include: "Jesus calls us; o'er the Tumult," "I Bind unto Myself Today" (LBW #450), and "There Is a Green Hill Far Away." Mrs. Alexander was a contemporary of Catherine Winkworth, who was the foremost translator of German hymns. Look on page 1194 in the back of the LBW for her name and check out the number of hymns given translation by Ms. Winkworth.
