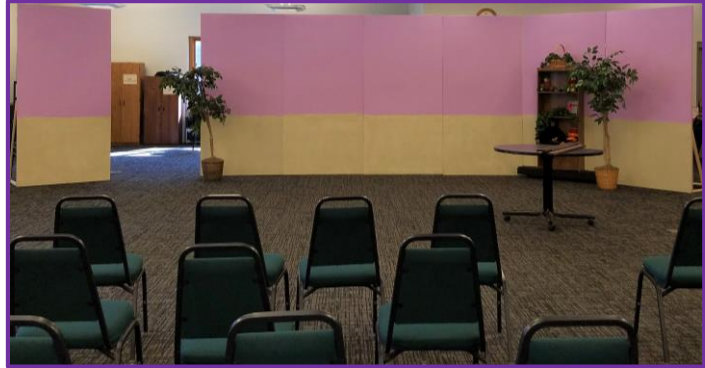

Spotlight – Columbarium

Grace Lutheran Church has a Columbarium in the Prayer Chapel. Grace's Columbarium is a forty-eight companion Garden Niche Columbarium that accommodates a maximum of ninety-six cremation urns. The purchase price of each niche is \$1200.00.



It has always been the obligation of the church to serve its congregation from baptism to death. Although earth burial on church grounds is not feasible at Grace, the desire to continue this sacred rite still remains for some members.

The Columbarium at Grace allows us to revive the crucial ministry of offering a rightful place at the church for those who have come before us. It also comforts the living with the knowledge that we too will be welcomed home to the church.



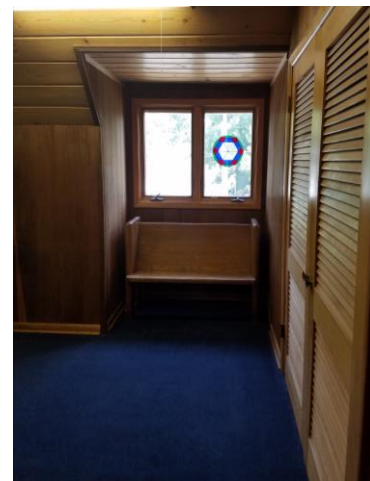

Finance Report – July Results

Financial results for July YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings – Actual \$257,552, Budget \$233,271
- Other Income – Actual \$16,861, Budget \$16,625
- Expenses – Actual \$258,424, Budget \$273,706
- Net activity – Actual \$15,989, Budget (\$23,811)



Actual net activity was favorable to budget by \$39,800. This was due partially to increased pledged and unpledged activity and also due to many expense areas under budget. Certain large projects around the church are being funded from Malmin funds.

A note from our bank:

We have recently had an influx of checks that are unable to be deposited due to incorrect payee and/or being incorrectly endorsed. In the past exceptions have been made but to avoid any further confusion, we would like to provide you with some clarification as to what is acceptable and what is not.

The “Pay to the order” line is extremely important because it tells exactly whom is able to cash or deposit the item. For that reason, this line must match the title of the account in which it is being deposited into. An example would be, a check made payable to *The Food Pantry* cannot be deposited into an account titled (*Grace Lutheran Church*). The payee’s do not match – making this an unacceptable item.

Another item we often see are checks made payable to a memorial, to a specific family member, or even to ‘the family of’. Checks made payable to a memorial will not be accepted, they will need to be deposited into a like titled memorial account.

It is preferred that checks always be made payable to your organization and any notations be made in the memo line. For example, a check made payable to (*Grace Lutheran Church*) notates *The John Doe Memorial* in the memo line.

We understand that unexpected situations arise and we will continue to address them on a case-by-case basis. However, we must make sure we are upholding First American Bank’s policies as well as doing what is right for our customers uniformly. We greatly appreciate your attention to detail going forward.

Commission For Church in Society meeting from the Southeastern Iowa Synod

Julie Honsey forwarded these notes regarding programs Grace participated in recently.

Proceeds from the hunger portion of the synod’s Forward Together Campaign (including Pigs for a Purpose) have been divided between ELCA World Hunger and work to fight hunger on the territory of this synod. To date about \$62,000 was received through Pigs for a Purpose. The synod money will be used to hopefully help sponsor an event with David Beckman as a part of the World Food Prize week.

Grace hosted Carol Fredrich at an adult forum to talk about the prison congregation: The FreeIndeed prison ministry has started on July 17 with Pastor Jerry Collell serving as pastor. The planning team will soon transition into the “Outside Council” to oversee and monitor the work of this congregation as it gets organized.

This Travel Bug is from KenyaConnect, and has traveled 11913.7 miles since it began its journey on September 21, 2016. KenyaConnect is an NGO dedicated to connecting students globally.

Confirmation

Confirmation classes will begin meeting again on Wednesday evenings from 6:30-7:30 on Sept. 13 with an orientation for sixth and seventh grade students and parents.

This Fall I am hoping to try something new with parent involvement for the sixth and seventh grade students. As a staff person here at Grace who relates to this group of students, I have the privilege of interacting with them 1 or 2 hours a week about 36 weeks a year. This limited amount of face time can have a great impact, but the person who makes ultimate impact made on a child's faith life is the parent/guardian. I have had many conversations where parents have expressed feelings of fear or inadequacy when discussing matters of faith with their children, concerned about giving the "wrong" answer or teaching the "wrong" thing. I see in these concerns an opportunity to partner with families and help parents build confidence and provide some knowledge for faith discussions with their children. I also see this as a way to offer youth more resources for building and nurturing lifelong faith.

Here is how I hope to seize this opportunity in our Confirmation ministry this coming program year-I am asking that each sixth and seventh grade family select one parent who will commit to serving in this role for the 2017/2018 program year. The hope that this will better equip families to do the work of faith formation while being accompanied by the Church in and through this Confirmation Ministry. We have a call and responsibility as the church to grow disciples and I see this as an opportunity to do just that.

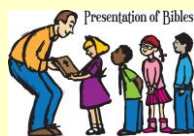
