Latino Ministry

Mission: The mission of Grace Lutheran Church is to bring the good news of God's saving grace through Jesus Christ's life, death and resurrection to all to be free to be the people of God.

Objective: To achieve unity of the faith, knowledge of the Son of God, maturity, and the measure of the full stature of Christ through encouraging and empowering the people of Grace to minister to one another in an increasingly diverse congregation and community.

Paradigm shift: We are not striving to have a separate Latino ministry at Grace but are striving to effectively minister to Latinos with the guidance and leadership of current Latino members and bridge builders, using the knowledge and insights we have gained throughout our 10 years of Latino ministry.

➤ **Worship**

- Continue on the current worship schedule through May
- Summer schedule: Saturday night worship, 9:00 worship in main sanctuary, 10:45 Spanish worship or alternative activity such as Bible study or informal gathering as needed for transition for combined worship service in fall.
- No weekly Spanish worship starting in the fall
- Fall worship schedule to be determined with intermittent bilingual and Spanish services
- Spanish translation of worship

➤ **Recommendations for staffing**

- Retain Ellen Wonderlin on staff through June
- Part-time Spanish speaking Latino Ministry coordinator with specific responsibilities that include translating worship and communications

➤ **Budget**

- Latino Ministry Coordinator (20 hours)
- Translation devices to be used in worship
- Decrease in cost of Latino Ministry projected by eliminating need for stipends for preaching, music and translation in Spanish worship
- Embed Latino Ministry expenses into general budget

SUPPORTING CONSIDERATIONS

Fellowship

We will welcome diversity, provide communication in Spanish, schedule multi-cultural events, and nurture one another in love.

Worship

We will regularly schedule bilingual worship services, provide Spanish translation at worship services, sing Spanish hymns, recite the Lord's Prayer in English and Spanish during worship, and partner English speaking members to be with non English speaking members during worship.

Prayer

We will continue to pray for unity in Christ Jesus.

Service

We will recruit Latinos or bridge builder representatives to serve on all church committees.

Advocate We will provide English and Spanish language learning opportunities as well as guidance in obtaining documentation and other particular social service needs specific to immigrants.

Educate

We will offer Bible studies in Spanish.

- El horario de Culto de otoño está por determinarse y alternara servicios bilingües y en Español.
- Habrá traducción del culto al Español

➤ **Recomendaciones en cuanto al Personal**

- Mantener a Ellen Wonderlin en la planilla a través de Junio.
- Un coordinador del Ministerio Latino de tiempo parcial con responsabilidades específicas que incluirán la traducción del culto y comunicaciones.

➤ **Presupuesto**

- Coordinador del Ministerio Latino (20 horas)
- Se utilizara equipo de traducción electrónico durante el culto
- Se proyecta disminuir el costo del Ministerio Latino eliminando la necesidad de otorgar estipendios por dar un sermón, música, y traducción del culto al español.
- Los costos del Ministerio Latino se integraran al presupuesto general.

CONSIDERACIONES SECUNDARIAS

Hermanidad

Damos la bienvenida a la diversidad, proveeremos comunicaciones en español, programaremos eventos multiculturales, y nos apoyaremos al uno al otro con amor y respeto.

Culto

Programaremos servicios bilingües regularmente, traducción al español durante los sermones, cantar himnos en español, recitar las oraciones del señor en Inglés y en Español y juntaremos a miembros de habla Hispana con miembros que hablen Inglés durante el culto.

Oración

Continuaremos rezando por unidad en Jesús Cristo.

Servicio

Se reclutaran a Latinos y sus aliados para servir en todos los comités de la iglesia.

Abogacía

Se proveerán oportunidades de aprendizaje de inglés y español al igual que asistencia para obtener documentación legal y cubrir otras necesidades de servicio para la comunidad inmigrante.

Educación

Se otorgan estudios bíblicos en español.

Stewardship Thought

In biblical times a steward was one who was given responsibility for managing a field or a vineyard on behalf of the owner. The steward was expected to ensure that everything was managed to accomplish the owner's intended purposes – in this case to guarantee a good yield and profit for the owner!

It is also the Christian church's understanding that everything that exists belongs to God. In fact, Rev. Harry Wendt, the author of the Crossways Bible study series, suggests that the Christian church would do well to add a phrase to the Apostles' Creed so that the first article would read: "I believe in God the Father, maker **and owner** of all things." This means that we ourselves, as well as our time, our abilities, and our money and other material possessions all really belong to God. God entrusts to us everything we have been given for our wise use.

So the Bible also uses the term "stewardship" to describe an important relationship between us, as believers, and God. God remains the owner of all things. We are entrusted with what God has given us and, as good stewards, we are held accountable by God to use what we have been given in ways that fulfill God's intention for the world. Surely, God intends us to use what we have been given to care for ourselves and our families. But God also expects that we will use our resources for purposes beyond ourselves. Because God loves all people and all of Creation, our stewardship involves sharing that portion of our resources that exceeds what is needed to meet our own needs. This is the way that God wants to provide for those who don't have enough and for the proclamation of the Gospel throughout the world.

This understanding of stewardship puts things in a whole new light! What a significant difference it would make for each of us if instead of asking "How much should I give?" we asked "How much of what is God's can I justify keeping for my own needs?" After all, God does expect that we will use what He has entrusted to us for things that are pleasing to Him.
