It is true...

The day was January 14th, 2011. It was a Friday, and as such I gathered with some friends who are also church professionals at a local establishment named Buffalo Alice. That group through many incarnations had met on Fridays around the same table for over a decade. We went by the nickname "The Buffalo Synod" and even appeared in The Lutheran magazine. There was even a "Visiting Clergy please check in" sign posted by our table. There were many conversations that had taken place around that table. Some were funny. Some were serious. Sometimes we laughed. Sometimes we grieved. All the while having a safe place to journey with one another.

It was on such an occasion that a friend spoke words that would forever change my life. I told the group that Grace Lutheran Church was soon to vote on extending a Letter of Call, and that if extended I would accept the Call, and his response was "Man, That's great! Grace in Des Moines is the best call in the whole state of lowa!" I knew Grace was special, but to hear this soon to retire pastor speak that highly of *any* congregation was a surprise, let alone so definitively about a place I was soon to be called to serve. In the years since, I have witnessed his declaration as true.

One area I have witnessed it to be true this past year is through the work of the Grace 2020 Team. We have been gathering since last May, discerning who we are as a community of faith. Our findings are that this is indeed an incredible place. As we talked about what we do best, we learned that our greatest strengths are perhaps the things that we take for granted. We are a place of acceptance and welcome. It doesn't matter who you are or where you come from, there is a place for you at Grace. Keep it up!

Given the roots of this community of faith, in the Augustana Synod, it is no surprise that Grace is a place that has a healthy relationship with leaders and pastors. It is a community of faith that always looks beyond itself to the needs of the greater church. Even when we received a large bequest, the first check that was written was to the Southeastern Iowa Synod. We continue to see the beauty in working together toward a brighter future in Christ.

Perhaps the greatest witness of the type of thing that makes Grace Lutheran Church the best Call in the state of Iowa, has happened these last few weeks. We gathered in our Annual Meeting in January and had a healthy discussion about the budget. There was an anticipated deficit of over \$26,000. Instead of looking at what cuts needed to be made, the decision was made to keep the budget and simply work together to eliminate the anticipated deficit. As of Monday, March 27th, we have had a response of \$26,880 in one time gifts and increased pledges!! Together, we stepped forward in faith knowing that God is at work here at Grace.

I am completely humbled by this response. To be called to serve here in January of 2011 was an honor and to serve you is truly a privilege. The Holy Spirit is moving in this place and there is a definite sense of anticipation as we look to these next chapters together. Thank you all for your response to the financial need. And even more than that, thank you for not only calling me, but supporting me in my work as your pastor.



Highlights of the February 28th, 2017 Council Meeting Dave Gronert, Council Secretary

- The 2020 Committee presented planning documents summarizing the work of the 2020 Committee to date, highlighting the overarching theme of "Growth with a Purpose" and its five supporting pillars of worship, education, outreach, well-being, and finance. The report included goals for each pillar. The next step is to break into small task forces to begin work to identify possible steps to implement these goals.
- A motion was passed to **change Grace Lutheran Church's street address** from the current 3010 52nd Street address to an Urbandale Avenue street address in order to make it easier for people to locate us. It was pointed out that the church actually fronts on Urbandale Avenue.
- The Malmin Fund Task Force presented an update. The Task Force is considering dividing the remaining monies into three separate "buckets"; Property and Capital Improvements, Outreach and Mission, and Financial. Also, the Task Force requested that the Council approve expenditure of up to \$25,000 of Malmin monies to fund a program of marketing and re-branding. This will include a new graphic identity (web site overhaul and new logo). Proposals will be accepted from three companies specializing in this work and a selection will be made by the Task Force and Staff members. The Council voted to approve the request.
- The Council approved a request by the Hunger Team to hold a fundraising event during Lent. "Pigs with a
 Purpose" will be coordinated through the Southeast Iowa Synod Hunger Initiative. Grace Lutheran will be allowed
 to display a plywood pig for each \$500 raised. The Team's goal is \$2,500.
- The Stewardship Committee reported it is optimistic about the Special Stewardship Appeal Toward a
 Balanced 2017 Budget letter mailed to the members of the Congregation. There will also be Temple Talks to
 further urge members to respond by completing the forms mailed with the letters and return them to the office by
 March 15th.

Finance Report – March Results

Financial results for March YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$103,198, Budget \$97,387
- Other Income Actual \$7,151, Budget \$7,125
- Expenses Actual \$108,325, Budget \$114,130
- Net activity Actual \$2,025, Budget (\$9,617)



Actual net activity was favorable to budget by \$11,642. This was due partially to increased pledge activity and also due to the timing of certain expenses. The one-time gifts given as part of the stewardship appeal will be recognized in the income statement evenly throughout the fiscal year.

The results of the Stewardship appeal exceeded expectations! A total of \$28,010 was either given as a one-time gift or given through increased pledging. The goal was to raise enough to eliminate the \$26,300 deficit budget. Thank you to all!

Crock Pot Drive Update!

The 10 crock pots you donated in February were so appreciated! We received this update from Shannon at Freedom for Youth in Mitchellville where the current class is being held.

"I wanted to update you on our crockpot class. We are off to a great start! We currently have 8 youth ages 6th -10th grade enrolled in our first ever crockpot class. They are doing amazing. Each week as we begin class, we start off with scripture and prayer. We then have a guest speaker who talks on a topic related to food. Then we prep our crockpot meal to take home. The students are really enjoying making the crockpot meals for their families. Some of them stated that they want to help at home more often and help mom by making dinner. After we prep our meals we get to sample the meal for dinner. As we eat we discuss employment topics. When our class is over we will be hosting a dinner restaurant style where each student will have their own positions they will be applying for. So, after our 6-week class is over our youth will have life skills that they have learned such as cooking, and employment training. Our prayer is that they will continue to strengthen these skills and take them with them into their adult lives and be successful. This class is going to be passed along to the other Freedom for Youth statewide locations and has potential to reach many kids. I would like to personally thank each person who donated a crockpot to help us provide this program at no cost.

Meals from the Heartland Spring Break, 2017

In 2 hours this past March, 20 participants from Grace had a blast, measuring, pouring, chatting, and competing! We were the last shift of 54 shifts that week. We each had a specific job, but a few of us swapped so we could try a few —soy, vitamins, rice, weighing, sealing, packing the boxes with the same mixture that we sampled during the Lenten Soup Suppers. Yes, plural soup suppers – we ate the rice/soy mix early in Lent, then Julie Honsey used extra packets mixed with chicken, vegetables and broth for chicken soup a few weeks later!

Some of the things we learned were that Meals from the Heartland prioritizes, and has never turned down a request from Iowa Food Pantries. In some countries, where perhaps an orphanage receives Meals from the Heartland meals, there might be a person whose job it is simply to open the packages for preparation for the meal. The cardboard shipping boxes are also well used: as pads between the ground/floor and bedding, as dressers, and stacked as cabinets. \$10 funds 50 meals.

Meals from the Heartland schedules shifts each week – you can join a team or put one together, just give them a call! Confirmation students will be participating here at Grace in late April – check out the Youth page 6 to read more!



National Child Abuse Prevention Month

According to Prevent Child Abuse Iowa, more than 8,200 Iowa children were found to be abused in 2015. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs and sexual abuse.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety and stability services, and mental and behavioral health treatment.

LSI's Early Childhood Services prevent child abuse by giving parents support and resources to build a healthy, stable home environment for their children. In 2016, our Early Childhood programs served more than 1,000 families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers!

Finding Her Confidence

Melissa didn't know what to do. Her oldest daughter, Brianna, struggled with anger issues and Melissa felt she was losing control at home. She wanted to have a loving relationship with her daughter, and she was afraid of becoming the "stern parent."

She turned to LSI's Mental Health and Behavioral Health Intervention Services for help three years ago

The services provide regular home visits and family meetings for Melissa and Brianna. Each week, Brianna's LSI team collaborates with her to find the coping skills she needs to thrive.

"We're trying positive reinforcement, we're practicing exercises like taking a pillow and screaming into it," Melissa says. "Instead of just yelling and screaming, we're finding an outlet for that anger."

Brianna is also learning to express herself through her favorite hobby: drawing. Melissa says her daughter is a visual learner, so the family is using art to help Brianna cope with her anger. Brianna loves her drawing exercises so much that she now wants to become an artist when she grows up.

Every step of the way, Melissa says she has felt empowered and supported by her LSI team.

"You get the positive support. As parents, you hear that you're doing a good job. You get that pat on the back when you're feeling defeated," she says. "Without these programs, our family would still be struggling. LSI gives you the tools you need."
