## **JOY**

While driving down Highway 71 between Spirit Lake and Spencer, a strange thing happened; I was passed by a woman driving very fast while KNITTING! I sped up to see if my eyes were deceiving me, but they were not. She was knitting. She was barely watching the road. She wasn't holding the steering wheel, instead reaching up on occasion to correct the cars trajectory as it hurled itself at about 80 mph down the road. I tend to put in a lot of miles in my little car, and have seen a lot over the years. I have seen people watching movies, texting, shaving, makeup, changing clothes...a lot of things. This, however, was a first, and I am hoping it is a last.

It is not that this is any worse than any of the other distractions. Any of them can be very dangerous to the driver and anyone on or near the road. The difference: if you haven't finished the knitting before you left in the car, it probably isn't going to get done while you're in the car. Knitting takes time. It gives you something to do while enduring other things, like movies or meetings. I have nothing against knitting, just not behind the wheel.

Believe it or not, I am actually going somewhere with this. We all have distractions. Life goes by really fast, and things distract us from what is important. There are so many things that take our attention from whatever we are doing. Sometimes those distractions are more like a text, a momentary shift in attention. Sometimes it looks more like greed or envy, as we cave to the illusion that the grass is greener on the other side. Whether looking down and discovering your children are now 9 and 18 months, or finding you now have a mostly white beard (ok, those are both me) it is easy to see that life goes by pretty fast.

With the pace at which we cruise through life, it is important to make sure the distractions don't become the attractions. It is important to always remember what is important. I find it odd that some things just stick with you after decades. I remember sitting in a church basement where a youth director talked about prioritizing life and used the word JOY. As a middle schooler, I immediately wrote it off as "cheese." The older I get, the more I find it to be true. We do need JOY, or as he put it, Jesus, Others, and Yourself.

It is important to remember Jesus and to keep Christ at the center. God chose to use the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus as that which proclaims the love of God. We should stay attentive to that love.

It is important to be mindful of our relationships with others. It is important to take time to build and maintain relationships with our family and friends. God has brought us together for a reason, and in the sharing of life, we strengthen one another in love.

It is important to be mindful of ourselves. Maintaining balance in life is important. It is easy to pay so much attention to other things and distractions that we lose sight of ourselves and our own needs. Take time to simply breathe and soak in God's love for you. Take time to do the things that charge your soul.

Pretty soon here the programmatic year will kick off and our schedule may well start to feel more like we're trying to knit while driving down the road at 80 miles per hour. Take time to enjoy today and every day that you are given. Make time for JOY.

# Church Council Highlights From the June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2017 Council Meeting

At the June 27th Church Council Meeting:

- The Council was informed that work is progressing nicely on the two downstairs bathrooms, and that work on the storage rooms is also progressing. The work in the library has been completed.
- The Council was informed that at some future date the Property Committee would like to replace the carpeting in the Gathering Hall and the Sanctuary.
- The Finance Committee reported that both the church and daycare budgets are currently "in the black", year-to-date. Also, the Stewardship Appeal resulted in \$17,520 being raised in one time gifts, and \$10,490 in increased pledges, for a total of \$28,010!
- The Personnel Committee reported that the newly hired Worship Office Assistant is helping to reduce the workload for other staff members.
- The Council was informed that work continues to select a design for the Little Library and Food Posts.
- **The Council granted permission** for the church to be used by the Centering Prayer Group to hold a retreat October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Various Synod and other groups will be attending.

## Finance Report – June Results

Financial results for June YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$215,375, Budget \$200,925
- Other Income Actual \$14,444, Budget \$14,250
- Expenses Actual \$222,804, Budget \$231,000
- Net activity Actual \$7,015, Budget (\$15,825)



Actual net activity was favorable to budget by \$22,840. This was due partially to increased pledge activity and also due to the timing of certain expenses. The one-time gifts given as part of the stewardship appeal will be recognized in the income statement evenly throughout the fiscal year.

Some geocaching rules from Sandy Briggs, who is maintaining the cache: You'll find all the information you need on geocaching on the website. When you find the cache sign the log/guest book. There is a tub of "swag" - help yourself to anything you'd like, and leave something that is equal to it. That way it perpetuates itself and there's always something inside for the next person. There are boxes for geocoins, and "travel bugs". Travel bugs are items that people take to other caches and the owners track where they go and how far they go. If you aren't into geocaching but want to find our geocache, you can still sign the log book and trade swag! We encourage everyone from our church to go there as often as they like.

Geocache News! We've retrieved a "Travel Bug" from another cache in Des Moines. ### **Grace Garden Notes:**

Marion, Julie, and Carla and Mike have all been BUSY in the garden, watering through the heat, harvesting beans, beets, carrots, peppers, and more. If you've read about Japanese Beetles hitting other gardens, well, they're in ours too. Carla has set out a bucket for them – every time we come across one, it gets to go swimming! The bush beans were finishing up when spider mites started making trouble, so the beans have been pulled and bagged for a few weeks in hopes of adding the greens to the compost without the spider mites.

The tomatoes are turning and looking beautiful, and the winter squashes growing. The eggplant hasn't yet flowered – it can be a touchy plant. Some years we have had great harvests, but some years it is a struggle. We'll give it another week or so before pulling to make room for fall crops.

Fall crops? Yes, we'll soon be replanting some of our best growers: red beets, turnips, onions, radishes, and bush beans! Colorful, nutrient rich vegetables that will grow well into the fall.

#### Happier, healthier families

For years, Bia struggled with her daughter's behaviors. McKenna, 8, lashed out against authority, and tempers regularly flared at home. "It took a little more time to work with her on anything," Bia said.

Bia couldn't find a way to help gain control of her child, and she became more and more frustrated. That's when her DHS social worker recommended LSI's Families Together program.

Through the program, Bia regularly meets with her Families Together worker, Gaylene. Together, they are working on what Bia calls a "three-step technique."

"Whenever a possible argument comes along, I start by telling McKenna to go take a break and reset herself. Then I can go calm down and eventually, we can talk it out," Bia says. "It's teaching both of us. My main goal right now is to learn how to better handle McKenna and better handle myself."

Bia is also practicing the technique with her younger daughter, Brynn, which she says is "working perfectly." It's drastically improving the way her family communicates, and Bia says she has recommended Families Together to any friends looking for guidance.

"I love the program," she says. "I love how it works and I know if I have questions, they can give me advice on how to go about things."
