Recent Events

The last couple of days have been far from the normal for parish ministry. That is not to say that there is a definite normal as much as it is to say that the last couple of days have been a really odd and surreal experience. We discovered on Sunday that there had been someone in our building on Friday who had left with things that were not his, including a television that was torn right off the Sunday School wall. We took proper action with the Des Moines Police Department. We also had reason to believe the individual had a stolen cell phone, which prompted the alert to check belongings.

Monday morning brought the discovery that he had gained access to the Minister for Administration's office. Our priority became making sure that nothing happened regarding finances, either personal or the congregation. This is what prompted the other alert about checking with financial institutions. If this caused panic, I am truly sorry. I am called to serve as your shepherd, and that is a calling that I take very seriously. It is my calling to look after the flock at Grace Lutheran Church. If that means causing alarm to ensure that all are safe, I am willing to do so.

In the 48 hours since that initial discovery we have studied the situation and have a much clearer picture of what was taken and what was not. This knowledge affords the luxury of hindsight. With your and our information being found safe, it is easy to look back and say that we should not have alarmed people. That is the problem with hindsight; it is easy to imagine something different. Days later it is easy to imagine responding differently. Life does not often allow the luxury of time and analysis.

If you responded with fear, that is a very healthy response. If the alert had you feeling completely unprepared for such a threat, this can serve as a reminder to make sure that precautions are taken in regard to your financial security. These vents can serve as reminders for all of us to be aware our finances and our surroundings.

Feeling fear is not a bad thing. It only becomes a problem if we remain in fear. There will be gravity in a couple different directions in the days, weeks, and months to come. Some will feel that because everything turned out to be ok beyond a few missing items, we can simply return to the way things were. Some will feel that we should respond with the locking down of the entire building. Neither outcome is what is healthiest for the community of faith.

Fellowship and Coffee Time!

Fellowship and Coffee Time are a wonderful part of our Sunday morning tradition here at Grace. Whether you enjoy your coffee in Grace Hall while chatting with friends old and new, bring your coffee to Sunday school, the front porch or garden bench in warmer weather, or find refills in Grace Hall during an Adult Education session, it's just an essential, welcoming part of the day.

Ross Peeler and Karen Taylor are the people you most often see serving behind the table or in the kitchen. Ross makes certain the donuts are ordered, or cancelled, if we have a special celebration with Cake or Cinnamon Roll Sunday. If you're curious, the donuts come from Donut Hut on Douglas, a local business we've worked with for years. Despite the frequent discussions about serving whole donuts vs. half donuts, at least with half donuts you can sample two different flavors!

We also serve juice, and tea. The addition of the plumbed coffee machines in the Gathering Hall simplify coffee time for everyone: Pre-measured coffee packets, and instant hot water make it easy for anyone to make coffee, whether on Sunday morning, or during a weekday or evening meeting. The hot tea spigot means a parent enjoying a little quiet time in the Gathering Hall during a confirmation project or before Daycare pickup can have an instant cup of hot tea. The thermal sealed coffee pots are easy to carry safely if you want to brew a pot of coffee for a meeting in the conference room, Gathering Hall, Grace Hall, Msindo... you get the idea. And no risk of tipping/spilling, especially if there are small children around. Coffee supplies are easy to find in the kitchen, the kitchenette in the Gathering Hall, or the coffee cart, which can be found in the Gathering Hall, or occasionally in Grace Hall.

We're always looking for more people to volunteer to serve Sunday coffee – sign up on the Grace website volunteer page! Preparing coffee at anytime is easy – just ask Ross or Karen or whoever is behind the serving table. Directions for using the new coffee machine are taped to the wall in the Gathering Hall Kitchenette. We just ask that you wash your pot when finished. Also, please don't unplug or turn off the machine – if you do, 20 minutes or so is required before a pot of coffee can be brewed.





Church Council Highlights From the January 30th, 2018 Council Meeting

At the January 30th, 2018 Church Council Meeting:

- The election of Church Council officers was held with the following results: President: John Roehrick; Vice-president: Bruce Bergman; Secretary: Dave Gronert; Executive Committee Representative: Tammy Denton
- The Council welcomed newly elected members Carter Woodruff, Connie Heuton, Tammy Denton, and Aaron Brandsfield.
- Council meetings will continue to be held on the fourth Tuesday of each month at 6 PM.
- The Council was informed by the Property Committee that:
 - LED lighting is being installed in Grace Hall, replacing fluorescent tubes currently in use. This will result in better lighting and reduced energy consumption.
- The Council was informed by the Malmin Fund Committee:
 - Mindi Dickinson of Dickinson Interior Consulting continues to work with the committee concerning upgrades in the Sanctuary, Gathering Hall, west entrance, and kitchen.
 - Don Peterson explained to new Council members how the Malmin donation was partitioned, and how various committees and the congregation can offer input as to the spending of those funds.
- The Council voted to approve a request by the Hunger Team to solicit donations of new
 or used electric skillets (or funds to purchase new ones). The skillets will be given to
 participants of a cooking class similar to the very successful slow cooker classes held last
 year.
- The Council voted to refer the establishment of a program and schedule for possible renovation and expansion of the pipe organ to the Worship and Music Committee.
- Barb Zimany volunteered to be one of Grace Lutheran's delegates to the Synod Conference to be held in May, 2018. Thank you, Barb!

Finance Report – January Results

Financial results for January YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$32,220, Budget \$32,721
- Other Income Actual \$2,290, Budget \$2,375
- Expenses Actual \$44,643, Budget \$41,171
- Net activity Actual (\$10,132), Budget (\$6,075)



Actual net activity was unfavorable to budget primarily due to expenses for repairs to the south entrance and to the boiler.

NCAA Bracket Fundraiser

March Madness is approaching! Selection happens on Sunday, March 11th. So, do you feel lucky? Local and regional charities hope so! We will hold the church pool again this year. There will be a \$5 entry fee and the winner will choose which charity will receive the pool monies. Last year, Sage Speck won and was able to give the \$185 pool to Youth Emergency Shelter & Services. So far we have given away a total of almost \$1500 due to this annual charity!

To enter simply fill out a bracket and turn it in to the church office between Sunday, March 11 and 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 15 with the \$5 entry fee. You should also note your chosen charity when you turn in the bracket. Brackets will be available in the church office or you can print your own Please either include cash, or make the check payable to Grace Lutheran Church with NCAA in the memo field. With no clear favorite to win this year, we will again use a scoring system with added points for the Final Four to keep things exciting. The "First Four" games will not be included. Those correctly predicting that a First Four team wins in the round of 64, even if the wrong First Four team, will receive the point. Then the round of 64 teams will be worth 1 point each with bonus points for upsets (difference between seeds). Round of 32 will be worth 2 points, round of 16 will be worth 4 points each. The following rounds will be worth 6 points, 10 points, and then 15 points for the correct Champion.


