

At the March 27th, 2018 Church Council Meeting:


- Property Committee Report:

The purpose of the committee is to provide a mechanism through which the staff can present any concerns, problems, changes, or grievances that might crop up.
- Action Item: Establish a Mutual Ministry Committee. It was moved, seconded, and passed to establish a Mutual Ministry Committee. The purpose of this committee is to provide a "sounding board" for Pastor Mike, to consider new ideas, air problems, and to provide an advocate should the need arise.
- Action Item: It was moved, seconded and passed to present Brooke Howsare with a contract for employment with GraceKids Daycare.

Endowment Fund Report

The purpose of the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is to promote faithful Christian stewardship by providing a congregational plan to receive grants, gifts or bequest of money to be used to enhance the total program and mission of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church beyond that supported through regular giving and apart from the general operation of the congregation. The Endowment Fund Committee acts as custodian of the Fund.

The Endowment Committee approved the following distributions of 2017 income:

Awards to Grace Lutheran Church:

- \$850 to support Moore Elementary's project with Opera Iowa
- \$1,520 for music storage cabinets at Grace
- \$217 for baptismal bibles
- \$663 for a cabinet to support the Frolic ministry for youth
- \$1,100 for a new library computer
- \$1,299 for an "Innovative Lab" to assist church staff and committees do creative planning and strategizing
- \$1,530 for a sanctuary hearing-assistance system
- \$2,200 for new windows on the third floor of Grace
- \$1,500 for school uniforms for Msindo and Mararo

Other Awards:

- \$400 for Grace Kids Care fun without wheels program. This provides assistance to purchase appropriate toys to be used in Grace's gym to protect and maintain the new flooring
- \$200 for Girl Scout Troop 296 food pantry to help serve those in need
- \$300 to Kaden's Closet provides "first night bags" of clothing and other necessities for a child's first night in foster care
- \$600 to Kiwanis Club ISU extension cooking class to help teach healthy cooking using an electric skillet when no other kitchen is available
- \$500 to From the Hearts Quilts provides weighted blankets to help autistic children

A total of \$12,879 was awarded. Requests for grants totaled \$21,516.

No parent should feel alone or hopeless when it comes to caring for their children's health. But those emotions were common for Judy four years ago.

It started when her son began seeing a litany of different doctors and specialists. Judy needed to coordinate his many appointments and medications, but it was difficult to keep track while still caring for her three other children as a single parent.

Judy found LSI's Pediatric Integrated Health services, which were a shoulder for her to lean on.

Judy's LSI worker, Wyndolyn, coordinated medical appointments and counseling sessions. When Judy's daughter required an Individualized Education Program (IEP) at school, Wyndolyn was there to keep in contact with the school and attend IEP meetings with Judy. When Judy's child began attending school at LSI's Bremwood Residential Treatment Center, Wyndolyn checked on him and provided updates to Judy. Wyndolyn also helped Judy to set up respite care through LSI's Services for People with Disabilities. Now, Judy can get a much-needed break while her children receive quality care from an LSI respite provider.

"We're one team now, we're on the same page," Judy says. "LSI has been a backbone for me when I wanted to give up. Wyndolyn talks to me when I'm stressed and ready to call it quits. She's really an advocate for my family. LSI has been a lifesaver."
