**1 John 3:18-24:** <sup>18</sup>Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. <sup>19</sup>And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him <sup>20</sup>whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. <sup>21</sup>Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; <sup>22</sup>and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. <sup>23</sup>And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. <sup>24</sup>All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. As I reflect on this list of saints from Grace Lutheran Church, I cannot help but think of how incomplete the list is. This list represents the saints from this community of faith, but there are so many more who have had profound impact on so many within this community of faith. I have cried over the loss that others have experienced and wept over loss within my own family. There is no escaping it. If you live long enough, you will know grief.

While in the early stages of grief this summer, a wise woman reminded me that to grieve means that I had loved. It is a profound truth that resonated with my soul so strongly I was nearly overcome. It is love that causes such grief, and maybe with that lies the blessing in it all. It does not diminish the loss, but rather highlights the love and relationship with the other.

The words above were spoken during my Mom's Memorial Service. They were picked for two reasons. First, knowing her we had to pick a text that spoke of love. She lived that with nearly everyone she knew.

Second, we knew that she would "whoop us" if we moped around on such an occasion. She wanted us to celebrate. So, we landed on 1 John 3, with verse 18 as the focus: "Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action."

Love is something that is somewhat easy to say, but our calling as part of the continuum of saints is to love in truth and action. That is where life gets messy. That is the sort of thing that brings about grief later. But, it is worth it, every minute of it. As we find ourselves centered in worship, held in grace, and sent forth in mission, let us never forget that true strength comes from love.

# Organ Fund Update as of 10/6/2018

Expected total project cost \$70,000 of which \$35,000 is needed from contributions.

Total Received: \$28,659.00 (both pledged and unpledged gifts). If all pledges are paid and no more pledges or unpledged gifts are received, total expected contributions by year–end: \$31,974.00



# Finance Report – September Results

Financial results for September YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$301,718, Budget \$298,787
- Other Income Actual \$23,004, Budget \$21,375
- Expenses Actual \$333,132, Budget \$331,937

• Net activity – Actual (\$8,409), Budget (\$11,775)



Actual net activity was above budget by \$3,365. A great turn around from the prior month's YTD deficit. Offerings are comparable to budget and unpledged activity has been above budget. Utilities and property improvements have been above budget and these overages have been offset by many smaller budget underages. These results do not include expenditures of the Malmin Funds.

While actual results are now above budget, a reminder that the annual budget reflected a \$10,000 deficit and it is hoped that additional positive results will help end the year at breakeven or better.

Additionally, Daycare has been operating with strong positive results and ahead of budget. Their results have far exceeded the prior four years.

# **Grace Kids Care**

Grace Kids Care is very excited to be getting a new center management and parent connectivity tool: Kangarootime! This system is located in the "cloud" so it works with all computers, tablets, and smartphones. The program provides many benefits that will streamline our center processes, improve security for all the children we care for, and provide a new and enhanced experience for our parents and trusted guardians.

Some of the new features our families will be able to enjoy with Kangarootime are:

- Secure child check in and out
- Ability to view photos and daily notes of children's day
- Update administrative documents
- Pay tuition online via credit care of checking account through a secure portal

This system will be a great benefit to both our families and staff, and will really allow us to be a more efficient.

# Helping to Carry the Load

Renato and Nellie Jimenez knew they wanted to adopt children. But when they learned about the desperate need for foster families, they also decided to open their home to children in need of safe, temporary care.

"We realized there are some big needs out there," Renato says. "Sometimes, we might not see it. But there are people suffering and struggling. We knew our family could make a difference." Over the last four years, Renato and Nellie have adopted four children and are currently fostering three. Their children range from 6 months to 14 years of age.

The couple enjoys supporting children of all ages, and they focus their parenting on helping them stay connected to their history and culture whenever possible.

Especially for older children, Renato says, it is vital to be given a safe space to open up and talk about the past in a healthy way.

"The most rewarding experience is the transformation of the kids. They come with baggage and they come hurt. But we can provide a home and love and security for them, so they know they belong in a family," Renato says. "Be there for the kids. The more healthy and supportive people these kids have around them, the better. Help them carry the load."

The meals often support and supplement other programs such as teaching sustainable agriculture practices, education, healthcare, and more. The meals are also used for disaster relief, providing nutrition and hope in the midst of epidemics and natural disasters that impact entire communities. Locally, they partner with food banks such as the Food Bank of Iowa, the Des Moines Area Religious Council (DMARC) food bank network, and dozens of church-affiliated food pantries. In 2015 alone, more than one million meals were distributed across the state of Iowa. **Let's join together to lend a hand!!!**

Set in the hide-away sink area in the Gathering Hall, this simple, easy to use coffee machine makes brewing coffee a breeze. The easy to carry thermos-style coffee pots keep coffee hot for hours, and greatly reduce the risk of spills and burns. Always on\*, just add a coffee filter, place an open pot under the filter, and press "Brew Start". Once closed, the silver handle on the thermos style pot is used as a pump so there is no need to pick up the pot to pour.

\*For instant access to hot water for tea, and no waiting for coffee, please do not turn the on/off switch to off. There is no burner to worry about.

\*For Sunday Morning coffee servers, brew 2 pots of regular and a pot of decaf prior to the service. Right before service ends, the water reservoir will have enough hot water again to fill a pot of water for tea, and 1-3 more pots of coffee as needed.
