

State of Grace

This last Sunday as we gathered for worship and our Annual Meeting, we spent time looking at the State of the Church. As the people of God at Grace Lutheran Church, we find ourselves trending with most other communities of faith in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This church body has seen a pronounced decline since the early 1990s. There are fewer members and a diminished average attendance. We have seen these same trends.

As I reflect on the worship and Annual Meeting I find myself thinking about the difference between the State of the Church and the State of Grace. As a church we are facing difficulties. The next months and years are vital as we look to paving a different future than the recent past we have known. The State of the Church paints a tough picture.

When I look at the State of Grace, I see something completely different. The grace of God is what the world needs. That which we live week in and week out, that grace that allows us to gather in community, share in the meal together, eat two different half donuts over a cup of coffee or tea, that grace of God made known most fully as we gather together in the name of Christ, that is the very thing that the world needs! Our world continues to be more divided. Yet, the grace of God is there, waiting to be known and shared.

When I look at the world through that lens, I see a different picture. This isn't a picture of a church struggling to stay relevant, or even alive. I see the possibility of a movement that could change the world. I see the possibility of a place where all feel invited to the same table, sharing the same good news of life and forgiveness, indeed grace, because of the life, death, resurrection and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. I see a future where we are no longer bound by numbers as the sign of vitality in a community of faith, but instead we see a river of grace bursting forth from headwaters at 52nd and Urbandale, flowing out into the world.

It is easy to look at the statistics and feel overwhelmed. I do that sometimes too. When I take a step back and look around, I see God active in the world in so many subtle yet profound ways. I see it in the friendships and relationships that are built here. I see it as we gather in worship together. I see it in the questions that burst forth. I even see it in the conversations and sentiments of frustration voiced during the budget forum. We are so blessed to have so many people who care deeply about God's ministry at Grace Lutheran Church.

God meets us here in this place. As we gathered together in Annual Meeting looking at statistics and financials, with questions about our future, God meets us there. *Continued page 2*

Minutes of the Congregational Council Meeting Grace Lutheran Church, December 18, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Bruce Bergman at 5:12 PM, with the following council members in attendance: Bruce Bergman, Don Peterson, Barb Zimany, Pastor Schmidt, Tammy Denton, Sally Preston, Cheryl Weatherington, Carter Woodruff, Aaron Brandsfield, and Dean Watson. Kevin Krause was also present to discuss budget planning for 2019.

Don Peterson volunteered to serve as acting secretary in Dave Gronert's absence.

Pastor Mike led us in devotions with some thoughts from his Bible study that morning. Condensed thoughts: "Keep with the Faith", "Finish the Race", "It's YOUR turn", "These people went before", "Others are cheering you on now".

It was moved, seconded, and passed to adopt the agenda.

It was moved, seconded, and passed to accept the minutes of the November 27, 2018 meeting as corrected, with the correction being the date of the Annual meeting, which will be January 27, 2019.

Property Committee Report:

- Renovation work has been completed in the West Entry, Gathering Hall and Sanctuary.
- Continued work is needed in Msindo. Wall repairs were completed by Trinity Construction and the rooms are ready for painting.
- The lift that was generously donated by Aaron Brandsfield's mother has been moved to the church and will be stored in Msindo Hall until a platform is constructed and it can be installed adjacent to the new platform.

Malmin Fund Report:

 Invoices that have been received from Mindi Dickinson totaled approximately \$6,400 more than the \$110,000 approved by the Council for the renovation work. The latest invoice was being held, pending a decision as to what account the additional funds would be charged. After a short discussion, there was a motion to increase the original approved amount to be paid from the Malmin Fund from \$110,000 to \$118.00. This motion passed.

Presentation by Kevin Krause for the Finance Committee regarding 2019 budget.

Expected budget shortfall for 2018 was discussed, as well as to whether the Council would present a budget at the annual meeting that would call for a balanced budget or budget shortfall for 2019. After considerable discussion, the Council decided to hold a special Council Meeting on Tuesday, January 8 2019 at 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of hearing the report of the Finance Committee regarding year-end figures for 2018 and their recommendations for the 2019 budget. Discussion will ensue, after which a proposed budget will be adopted by Council for presentation to the congregation at the annual meeting on January 27th. The Grace Operating Budget and the Budget for Grace Kids Care for 2019 will be the sole subject of this special meeting of the Council.

Nominating Committee Report on nominees for 2019 Congregation Council membership:

Dave Gronert, Sally Preston and John Rhoerick have all graciously agreed to run for an additional three year term. Another nominee will be sought to fill the other position.

General Questions/New Business:

Dean Watson asked about how recently we have had a review of our insurance policies and what we have considered in the way of additional funding for our Property Reserve account. This will be referred to the Finance and Property Committees for consideration and appropriate action.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:35 PM

- Date and time of the next regular council meeting will be determined by the new Council following the Annual Meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, January 27th.

Emergency Preparedness Reminder

In 2016, Grace's Emergency Preparedness Task Force created an emergency action plan for a variety of emergency situations. We encourage you to look through the materials because *familiarity with them before an emergency actually occurs* will make you more equipped to handle a situation in the heat of the moment.

There is an AED located outside the Grace Staff Office, along with a Sharps container for the disposal of needles.

Information and first aid kits are available in various parts of the building, including:

- Just outside the Grace staff office
- In the Gathering Hall behind the kitchenette
- In the kitchen
- Msindo café just outside the Music room
- The gym hallway area, across from the Youth rooms.

The resources in these areas include:

- First aid kit and booklet
- General first aid guidelines and reminders
- Map with exits and tornado safe rooms marked
- Church name, address, phone number
- Emergency phone numbers
- Bomb threat phone checklist
- Incident report forms
- Procedures for dangerous/intoxicated adult, missing/abducted child, active shooter, robbery, fire, severe weather/natural disaster, gas odor/leak

Spring Youth Ministry

Over this past weekend I attended the ELCA Extravaganza Children Youth and Family continuing education conference. This a time of renewal and a chance to connect with others who work with the children and youth of our church. We all bring our worries, cares and concerns hoping to hear a word of hope and truth from a speaker, preacher or peer. We find community in the shared burdens and joys of what it means to serve in this ministry of faith formation.

One common theme that is heard from most faith communities is lower numbers and busy families. There were a lot of ideas and suggestions on how to adapt to this reality. Some we have tried here at Grace and have been successful, such as implementing a mentor program with our eighth grade students. Others, like posting a youth event calendar where Grace members can see, pray for and attend the things our youth are involved in when they are away from this place, we tried and were not successful. But even the ways in which we define success in youth and family ministry are changing. Is success measured in numbers or transformation? How many opportunities are offered, or the depth of connection and conversation reached when youth and adults gather.

Quantity vs quality.

Quantity is easier to measure, but quality does the work of transformation.

Grace Lutheran Church has the vision of guiding people to live differently through Christ. This means doing the work of transformation by offering quality faith experiences. This can be a tricky business because there is no one size fits all solution, what is meaningful for one may not be for another. That means we offer variety, are adaptive and above all listen. Listen to the spoken and unspoken desires and concerns of our young people.

You know that saying "it takes a village to raise a child"? We are that village. It takes all of us to make young people feel welcome and connected to this faith community so that they are comfortable enough to take a risk and be vulnerable. Vulnerability is when growth happens. Growth is the Holy Spirit at work in us and that is what I pray our youth and families will come to expect as a part of their experience at Grace.

Gustavus Jazz and Orchestra Performances at Grace

The Gustavus Symphony Orchestra and the Gustavus Jazz Ensemble are performing at Grace Lutheran Church on Saturday, February 9th at 2:30 p.m. This concert is part of their Midwest tour, beginning in South Dakota and traveling through Colorado, Nebraska, and Iowa. Admission is free; no ticket required. A freewill donation will be taken during the performance.

The Gustavus Symphony Orchestra and Gustavus Jazz Ensemble have a rich history of touring and performing together, both domestically and internationally. Each ensemble will perform its own repertoire, but also combine to form a studio orchestra, creating a unique musical experience for the audience. Musical selections range from classic jazz and orchestral works to newer pieces by current composers. Previously, the groups have traveled to the British Isles, the People's Republic of China, South Africa, and Greece and Macedonia. Their next tour is to Singapore and Malaysia in January of 2020.

Located in Saint Peter, Minnesota, Gustavus Adolphus College is a private, coeducational, liberal arts college affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. More than one-third of all Gustavus students participate in the music program, with three choirs, two wind orchestras, two symphony orchestras, two jazz ensembles, and numerous chamber ensembles that total over 30 musical ensembles on campus.

They will be able to check out more than one book if parents help them. Otherwise, we'll keep it to one.


