Sabbatical FAQ

As preparations continue for the coming sabbatical, many of the same questions come up. So, I will offer answers here.

When are you leaving? The sabbatical will begin following worship on Celebration Sunday, May 19th. There will be a send off as part of that service and a welcome upon return.

When will you return? I will be back in the office on Monday, August 19th and back in worship on August 25th.

Where are you traveling? My family and I will do some traveling and attend several different churches, but it is not practical to do extensive travels or prolonged absences with a young family.

What are you studying? I will be taking a Kairos Couse, Dare to Lead, in Minneapolis. The curriculum for the course is based on the Brené Brown book with the same title. In addition to this course I am building some skills through a mentorship and a diverse reading list. A little over half of the reading is specific to church work, and the rest deals with workplace culture.

Stump the Pastor and Ellen

On Sunday, March 31 Pastor Mike and I (Ellen) hosted a Stump the Pastor lunch and invited youth in grades 6-12 and their parents to ask us "tough" questions of faith and life. We had some very thoughtful questions and some honest discussion. After this lunch, I put the question box back in the library and let everyone know it would stay there to receive more tough questions and that Pastor Mike and I would check it periodically. Within weeks of lunch, there were more questions in there! Tough ones!

As we don't have another Stump the Pastor lunch planned until the fall I wanted to respond in a timely manner here. I want our youth, and everyone at Grace, to know that church is the place to ask these tough questions. You will be heard and taken seriously and I will answer them to the best of my ability with love and honesty.

Here are two tough questions found in the question box and my response-

Did God create Love?

My belief is that God is Love, and that all of creation flows from Love. Where you see Love in the world, God is there. When you feel Love, that is God. God connects us, just as Love connects us. Love is powerful, Love conquers all, just as God does. If you replace the word Love anywhere you see the word God, it makes a lot of sense. So, to ask if God created Love is an interesting question. If God is Love and God always is then Love was not created but has always been.

If God is all powerful then why (doesn't) he stop bad things from happening to people?

Man oh man, this is THE question...right? It is so hard for us to wrap our minds around a loving God with unlimited power who won't intervene on our behalf when bad things happen. If God can fix it, why doesn't he? This makes me think of the movie Aladdin. There are three wishes that the Genie can't grant; 1) He won't kill anyone 2) He won't make anyone fall in love and 3) He won't bring anyone back from the dead. What about the Deathly Hollows in Harry Potter? One brother wants power, another to bring back a loved one from the dead, and the other to avoid death. It seems that there are many mythologies that ask this same question and speak to these same human desires and fears. How do I avoid pain? How can God keep me and those I love from suffering?

One thing that I think about when I struggle with this question of bad things happening is how connected we all are, and how suffering often bring others to us. If God kept me from suffering, what impact does that have on those around me? Do others suffer more because I suffer less? In this life and in this world there is sin and sin in its many forms has a ripple of consequences. It is my belief that sin causes suffering. This is not to say that sinners deserve to suffer, for we are all sinners and I don't believe that suffering is deserved. But, we are all interconnected and our choices have consequences for ourselves and for others, and sometimes these consequences live for ages and ages. So, does God allow suffering as our punishment for sin? No. Suffering is a part of being human, just as sin is a part of being human. We are not perfect. We are broken. We mess up. In all of it, God is there in ways that we cannot possibly understand, no matter how much we may want to. That can be comforting but also frustrating for those of us who seek to understand things. I have no easy answers, and I offer more questions but we are in this together.

Church Council Highlights March 26, 2019

Devotions: Pastor Mike led the devotions with a reading from Psalm 63, reflecting on how the love of God is a blessing; regardless of the highs and lows we may experience daily, God has a plan for us.

Property Committee Report:

- Boiler controls were repaired through the property reserve funds.
- Updates for Msindo (basement): The flooring and painting has been completed for the Quilting Room. Additional work is still needed to install the lift and clean up the floor in the "old" kitchen space and replace flooring in the Women's restroom.

Malmin Fund Report:

The work on organ has been completed. We are waiting for the final bill from Schantz.

Action Item: Don Peterson will provide a fund balance once all invoices have been received.

Finance Report:

- Financial report was reviewed and discussed. The February year-to-date results reflected a
 net loss due to an increase in property insurance premiums, maintenance on the boiler,
 increased snow removal costs, and a reduction in income from pledged offerings.
- Daycare financials were favorable. The office staff continue to work with a consultant to evaluate and optimize the Daycare program operations and finances.

It was moved, seconded, and passed for Kevin Drury to host a car show at Grace where the participant entry fee paid by the car owners will go to the Member Care fund. Kevin will coordinate around the church calendar.

Sabbatical - Pastor Mike discussed the progress of his sabbatical plans for this summer, 5/20 - 8/19.

It was moved, seconded, and passed to appoint Rick Stammer to the Finance Committee. Rick will abstain from all salary conversations.

It was moved, seconded, and passed to change the property insurance plan to lower the premiums presented by Dean Watson.

Finance Report - March Results



Financial results for March YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$108,125, Budget \$98,050
- Other Income Actual \$7,358, Budget \$7,125
- Expenses Actual \$124,461, Budget \$108,612
- Net activity Actual (\$8,979), Budget (\$3,437)

Actual net activity was unfavorable to budget by \$5,541. Pledged offerings were below budget in February primarily due to the weather, this shortfall was completely recovered in March. Additionally, expenses were above budget due to boiler repairs, flooring repairs, higher insurance and snow removal costs.
