"And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:17

The month of November starts and ends with giving thanks. We gather at the start of the month in celebration of All Saints and by the end of the month we are gathered around tables for the celebration of Thanksgiving. The month itself serves as a reminder of how we live out this imperative that the apostle Paul lays before us in his letter to the people of Colossae.

There is also a tension present in this month. Even while giving thanks for the lives of all the saints who now from their labors rest, one cannot help but be held with grief at the same time. There is a real loss that we experience, and grief remains with us. It is sometimes a silent passenger that softly, quietly, subtly, reminds us of what once was or could have been.

As we celebrate All Saints, we find our home in that tension between thankfulness and grief. For many of us, that is where we are throughout the year, but this day creates safe space for us to acknowledge the pain of the losses we have known. That is the beauty of the church; the church has a space that can hold that pain.

In the same way, the celebration of Thanksgiving holds the same tension. There is incredible thankfulness for all that God has done. Our meals shared become an extension of the Lord's Table, and we enter a profoundly personal Great Thanksgiving with family *"Front Page" continued on page 5*

## A November to Remember

As we at Grace move through the month of November into the season of Advent, we will spend time naming and claiming the shared grief we feel for the Church of the past. It seems that more and more we look back with sadness that the Church is not the same as it was 5, 10, 50 years ago. The hope is, that by sharing our grief we will come to terms with it and be free to move towards the future into which Christ calls us. This month grief will be addressed both in worship and in some interactive ways outside of services.

## **Memorial Wall**

Church is not dead. However it is ever-changing, perhaps at a pace and in a way for which we have not prepared ourselves. This memorial is a safe and visible way to mourn the Church that shaped our Faith, and the activities, worship events, and fellowship gatherings that have changed so much. In acknowledging our grief through this month, we ready ourselves for the season of Hope that is Advent.

Consider offering an item to display. Some thoughts to ponder as you think about placing an item on the wall:


- What does grief look like?

- The Kubler-Ross stages of grief are Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, and Acceptance.
- How do these play out in the life of the church? Where might you place yourself at this point in time?

- Use the provided writing utensils, paper, and clothespins to attach your memorial offering to the fence. Or, leave larger items to display on the floor next to the fence.

Church Council Highlights From the September 24th, 2019 Council Meeting

# At the September 24th, 2019 Church Council Meeting:

- Staff and Financial Reports:
  - The Council reviewed the monthly Staff reports.
  - Church and Grace Kids Care financial reports were reviewed and discussed. Daycare finances continue to be in the black. Church giving is ahead of budget, however some large unexpected expenses have placed us in a deficit position.
  - $\circ$  Daycare will be fully staffed October 1st.
- Capital Campaign
  - Tammy Denton will chair the Capital Campaign Committee.
  - Len Ringgenberg will chair the Steering Committee.
- Nominating Committee
  - The Council moved to form a Nominating Committee. This committee is charged with seeking nominations to fill the Church Council vacancies and also to seek nominations for Council officers for the upcoming year. President Bergman asked the Council to submit names of persons willing to serve on the Nominating Committee to the members of the Executive Committee prior to its October 9th meeting.
- Little free Pantry/Pergola Project
  - Don Peterson reported that these items are now stored in the garage pending approval of the permits by the City of Des Moines.
- Property Committee
  - The Property Committee received a quote from Spectrum Lighting for materials for the new cove lighting. The Committee will seek quotes for installation labor, as Spectrum won't do the installation. Perhaps it will seek a quote for a turnkey job.

# Finance Report – September Results

Financial results for September YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$307,105, Budget \$300,850
- Other Income Actual \$23,093, Budget \$22,375
- Expenses Actual \$359,005, Budget \$328,537
- Net activity Actual (\$28,807), Budget (\$5,312)

Actual net activity was unfavorable to budget by \$23,495. This deficit is unlikely to be recovered by year-end. Pledged offerings are below budget while unpledged offerings were above budget. Expenses were significantly above budget due to boiler repairs, flooring repairs, HVAC replacement, higher insurance and snow removal costs.

I am thankful for the lives of all of these saints who from their labors rest. I have learned different things from each of them. They will all be missed greatly. That is the beautiful tension of November.

#### **Dick Johansen Honored**

The Upper Midwest Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences awarded Dick Johansen his first Emmy at their Gala on Saturday, October 5<sup>th</sup>.

In 2009, KCCI-TV featured Dick during their series of reports on the first Honor Flight for central lowans. Honor Flights are a one-day trip for veterans to see the WWII, Korean & Vietnam War monuments in Washington, DC. When reporter Eric Hanson set about doing a retrospective of the past 10 years of these flights, one of the only folks still living was Dick Johansen. Eric and Dick sat down together and talked about how the trip had impacted his life and memories of his service.

KCCI submitted that program – Decade of Honor – for the Chapter's most prestigious award, the Governors' Emmy. This award, voted on exclusively by the Board, honors visionary, long-standing relationships that creatively and effectively use corporate, non-profit and broadcast resources to showcase the power of broadcasting to advance a mission or message and Decade of Honor was the unanimous choice.

Long-time financial backers of the Central Iowa Honor Flight Hy-Vee and Casey's were also recognized, but it was Dick Johansen who received the longest standing ovation anyone could remember at an Emmy Gala. It was also Dick who had a line of admirers to take photos with him, including Minneapolis sportscasting legend, Mark Rosen!

Amy Schmelzer was privileged to award Dick his Emmy as part of her service on the Board of Governors. Robbie Rissman was also honored with an Emmy for his contribution to KCCI's Close Up: The Gun Debate special.

## Little Free Pantry and Pergola are a reality!

Thank you to everyone who worked on this project, especially Ellen Rothweiler for nurturing students to live and act on their Faith to help others, Chuck Denton for installing the Little Free Pantry cabinets in their current position, Rich Voelker for design ideas, Don Peterson for design, purchases, ordering the cabinets/construction, ordering and installation of the sign, Active Grace participants and Thrivent for the Action Funds and products to fill the pantry, and Don Peterson and Pastor Michael Schmidt for explaining and defending the ideas to the City for our permit! We also want to thank the neighbors who responded in favor of the project, and to the Merle Hay Neighborhood Council for its support of the project.

The Pergola with bench will be installed as soon as we have a decently warm day (and unfrozen ground) – so that may have to wait until Spring. But it is coming, and we hope will be a spot well used by all in the Grace and Grace Kids Care Community and surrounding neighborhood: those who wish to help their neighbors in need, a place to have a snack, a place to choose and read a book as well a safe place to find emergency supplies for those in times of need.

We are still collecting food items for DMARC in the basket in the entryway. For now, we ask that you do not place fresh produce in either spot. The best item to choose are non-perishable foods, staples, baby, and personal hygiene items. Warm clothes (mittens, gloves, hats, scarves) are also great this time of year. Add one to your cart each week and place in the pantry. We'll post a list of other ideas in the office hallway soon! The more people seen at the pantry, the more people will feel safe and unjudged being seen at the LFP.

### A Growing Family

Lindsey and Andrea were no strangers to foster parenting. Their older brother fostered children for 10 years, and they were inspired by his drive and passion for supporting vulnerable children. Until recently, they hadn't seen themselves as foster parents. But something in their hearts told them they were needed.

"It's been on our hearts for a lot of years, and we have the room and love," Andrea says. "It's something we knew we could do and it's needed." The two sisters decided to become licensed foster parents earlier this year through LSI Foster Care and Adoption. Now, they are caring for children in foster care at the same time. Lindsey and Andrea regularly meet up to support one another and ensure the children can connect and feel less alone during the most vulnerable time in their young lives.

"It's been so important to have a connection to another foster family," Lindsey says. "The kids can see they're not different. There are other children in their same situation."

Meanwhile, they are busy building a strong bond with the children's birth families. Lindsey says foster parenting is a way for them to give a child stability while also nurturing their whole family.

Lindsey and Andrea have also found support from other local foster families. They are there for each other, offering a shoulder to lean on when anyone needs an extra boost on the difficult days.

"There is a need for foster families in Iowa, and there is so much good that comes out of fostering," Andrea says.
