No Bake Snowballs

This cookie is a favorite memory from Rich's elementary school lunches in Ames. We tried for years to find a recipe that measured up to the memory, and had given it up as a lost cause until we tried this recipe from Hy-Vee that is apparently spot on! I've made sure to make a few copies of the recipe just to make sure we don't lose it! **Yield:** 55-65 cookies. (I never manage more than 55!)

1 cup unsalted butter
3 ³/₄ cup confectioners sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
³/₄ cup Flake coconut, unsweetened
2 ¹/₄ cup quick oats
¹/₂ cup semi-sweet chocolate chips, chopped small, or use mini chips.
Extra confectioners sugar for rolling

- 1. In a large bowl, beat butter until smooth. Gradually add Confectioners sugar until smooth and light. Add vanilla and mix well.
- 2.Add coconut, mix well. Add the oats in parts, mixing well. Finally, add in the chocolate and mix well.
- 3.Using a little less than a Tablespoon to measure, roll the dough into balls, and roll in confectioners sugar.
- 4.Place in a sealed container and refrigerate for 4-24 hours before serving. These will be fine at room temperature for a few days, store the rest in the fridge or freezer.

Notes: If you taste it right after mixing, it is very sweet. Give it a good 24 hours to let the coconut and oats soften, the sweetness diminishes and the flavors meld beautifully. You should also be able to decrease the confectioners sugar by ³/₄ cup and increase the oats by 1/3rd cup.

Christmas Egg Dish

Rich's sister Vicki served this every Christmas morning for the family brunch. Now we have it Christmas morning, New Years morning, Easter. It is easy (and best!) to prepare it the night before, then pop in the oven for a delicious easy holiday breakfast. Perfect when everyone needs a break from the sweets from their stockings. This recipe is easy to double. These days we make 1 regular recipe, and one vegetarian.

1# Milk Pork Sausage (If vegetarian, simply leave out, or use onion and vegetables of your choice) 6 eggs

- 2 cups milk
- 2 slices bread, cubed
- 1 tsp. dry mustard

1 cup cheddar cheese, grated

- 1. Brown meat and drain, or sauté vegetables
- 2. Beat eggs and add remaining ingredients.
- 3. Place in a baking dish, cover, and refrigerate overnight.
- 4. 1 hour before baking, remove dish from refrigerator and uncover. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- 5. Bake for 1 hour, let set for 5 minutes before cutting and serving.

Leftovers can be refrigerated for a day and reheated.

Electronic Giving Changes Details

Our church has offered an option for electronic giving through Push Pay for the last three years. For a number of reasons, many of which are financial in nature, we are ending our contract with Push Pay at the end of 2020 and have set-up an account with Tithe.ly.

Tithe.ly has no monthly fees for basic services compared to the \$200/month fee that Push Pay charged. Transaction Fees are similar. They range from 1% +.30 per transaction to 3.5% + .30 per successful transaction. The 1% is for ACH payments and the 2.9% or 3.5% are for Credit Cards. The 1% + .30 for ACH is the lowest of the fees.

Tithe.ly was created for churches and is one of the preferred vendors for our Southeastern Iowa Synod and the E.L.C.A. It is the platform that is used by the Synod Office.

Your church is grateful for your electronic giving. Having the option to give electronically has certainly been helpful during this pandemic!

So how do you start using Tithe.ly?

- If you go to our church website, <u>www.gracedm.org</u>, and click on the GIVE link at top right, it will take you to a donation page with Tithe.ly. You will see a large blue bar at the top and Grace Lutheran Church, Des Moines, IA. The fields include: Give amount, Fund options, a box to check if you want your gift to be recurring and how often, First name, Last name, Email address, Card or Bank, and a box to check if you want to cover the transaction fees.

Tithe.ly Giving Transaction Fees

You pay \$0 setup and \$0 per month to use Tithe.ly giving. The Tithe.ly per-transaction fees apply any time a payment (eg. donation or gift) is processed on the Tithe.ly platform via a credit card, debit card or ACH/Bank (US Only).

- 2.9% + 0.30 per successful charge VISA, MasterCard, Maestro, Discover, JCB, Union Pay, Diners
- 3.5% + 0.30 per successful charge American Express
- 1% + 0.30 per successful charge ACH/Bank Transfer
