P: Let us confess our sin, trusting in the abundant grace of God. Silence is kept for reflection.


P: Holy God,





First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10 (Whirl Story Bible)

Jonah was a prophet, but he didn't feel like God's messenger. As he crawled up the beach, he felt slimy and smelled like fish.

"JONAH!" God's voice boomed. "Go tell the people in Nineveh I'm angry at the way they are living."

Jonah groaned. God had asked him to do this before, but Jonah was sure the people would not listen. He tried to run away, but God had him swallowed by a giant fish. The fish spit him out here on the sandy beach, where God spoke to him again. Jonah covered his ears, but he could still hear God. "Jonah! GO TO NINEVEH!"

Jonah brushed off the sticky sand. Running away again wouldn't work. He didn't want to go, but he needed to do what God asked. He dragged himself to Nineveh. Prayer after Communion


