C: Amen.


P: Let us confess our sin, trusting in the abundant grace of God. Silence is kept for reflection.

C: Amen.









News of what happened in the synagogue spread all over town, Soon, everyone knew about Jesus!



P: For the covenant God made with us in the waters of baptism, in thanksgiving for the baptized who have died in the Lord, let us pray. **C: Have mercy, O God.**

P: Merciful God, hear the prayers of your people, spoken or silent, for the sake of the one who dwells among us, your Son, Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

All: God of love, have mercy on us. Pour out your Spirit upon us. Center us in worship. Hold us in grace. Strengthen us in love. Send us forth in mission. In Jesus' holy name. Amen.


P: Beloved: here is bread; here is wine. Here is Jesus. Come and be fed.


Distribution
