November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. For LSI, it is a time to celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption, and to raise awareness for the hundreds of Iowa children in need of a safe, healthy home.

In 30 counties across western Iowa, LSI Foster Care and Adoption recruits, licenses, and supports foster and adoptive families to ensure every Iowa child grows up in a safe, stable environment.

But more work needs to be done. According to the most recent federal data, more than 100,000 children in the U.S. are waiting to be adopted from foster care, and thousands of teens age out of foster care every year without a permanent family. Giving Back to Their Community

Amber and Donald had always felt called to provide foster care. But any time they would consider taking the leap and starting the process, the thought of "what if?" would leave them feeling stuck. Now, Amber can't imagine life without the children her family has cared for over the years.

Amber and Donald became licensed to provide foster care and adopt children almost seven years ago. Since then, they have provided foster care for 17 lowa children and adopted six. Amber says one of her favorite parts of the experience is seeing her adult children bond with each child who enters their home.

"It's crazy to see our 25-year-old so bonded with our two-year-old. We don't label the kids as 'adoptive' or 'biological', they're just all our kids," Amber says. "That bond is just as huge whether it's biological or not."

As lowa continues to see a need for more foster and adoptive families, Amber says becoming licensed is one way lowans can give back to their community.

"God gives us all gifts, and parenting and helping in the community seemed to be what He put in our hearts," Amber says. "If you haven't found a place to help in your community, consider foster care and adoption," she says. "It could be exactly what your purpose is."

Finance Report – September Results

Financial results for September YTD are as follows:

- Pledged Offerings Actual \$291,354, Budget \$302,925
- Other Income Actual \$12,141, Budget \$17,225
- Expenses Actual \$313,093, Budget \$339,387
- Net activity Actual (\$9,599), Budget (\$19,237)

Actual net activity was favorable to budget. While offerings continue to be below budget, certain salary and utility expenses have offset this variance to a greater extent to achieve the overall favorable results.

Congregational Council October 2021 Meeting Highlights Grace Lutheran Church

October Church Council Highlights:

(October 10th) It was moved, seconded, and passed by e-mail vote to allocate Grace Kids Care PPP funds to address the immediate HVAC needs ahead of winter.

(October 10th) It was moved, seconded, and passed by e-mail vote to accept the proposal from Dayton Heating and air conditioning LLC to provide and install seven furnaces to address our immediate HVAC needs.

(October 15th) It was moved, seconded, and passed by e-mail vote that Grace Lutheran will contract with Portico (health insurance provider) to provide the Silver+ plan to its Rostered leaders.

The Council met in person in Grace Hall October 19th. Council members attending were Bruce Bergman, Aaron Brandsfield, Susanne Carney, Alex Davik, Dave Gronert, Tom McCleary, Linda Moravec, Pastor Mike, and Dean Watson. Staff members attending were Denise Friesth, Rich Snyder, Emma Stammer, and Michelle Volker.

After devotions, the Council continued discussion of the book <u>The Five Most Important</u> <u>Questions You Will Ever Ask About Your Organization</u>, by Peter F. Drucker. **The Council received and reviewed** the financial and staff reports.

Grace Kids Care:

- It was moved, seconded, and passed to allocate the remaining Grace Kids Care PPP funds to be used toward the greatest capital needs of the church.
- It was moved, seconded, and passed that the Grace Kids Care program be permanently closed.
- It was moved, seconded, and passed that remaining Daycare property will be sorted into items that can be sold, items that can be donated, and items to be discarded and disposed of accordingly.

Property Committee Report:

- See activity above regarding HVAC.
- A claim against the City of Des Moines is being processed regarding damage from the recent sewer backup in Msindo Hall.

The council continued discussion of the possibility of adding a second minister.

The Council appointed John Roehrick, Dave Gronert, Sally Preston, and Susanne Carney to form a nominating committee to locate members interested in serving on the Church Council. **Next scheduled Council meeting** will be November 16th, 2021.
