It would be easy to focus on the difficult parts of the last year. The loss of my brother, Jason, comes to mind, along with the loss of so many saints from Grace Lutheran Church and beyond. Closing Grace Kids Care was an incredible loss. The whole building feels different without all the little ones running around and making noise. Ellen's departure has left a hole as well as an empty office. A celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord in an empty sanctuary for the second straight year was incredibly difficult. The lingering pandemic and the mental toll is exhausting. An attempted overthrow at the Capital, and the growing political divide is worrisome. The impact of having Covid, both physically and mentally, has been rather draining.

The lens of gratitude helps keep the year in perspective. I was able to celebrate 10 years of ministry here at Grace Lutheran Church. We were able to gather in person for the first time in over a year. It has been an absolute joy to see faces (yes, you can see facial expression through the eyes while one wears a mask correctly). We can imagine a future as a teaching congregation, applying to be an internship site. We can look at opportunities to use the building in new ways. We are continuing to adapt to hybrid ministry opportunities and growing together.

Ordinarily, I would wish you all a "Happy New Year." Today, I simply hope that we can all have a good year. May we depart 2021 and approach 2022 with a lens of gratitude. Like any other year, there will be highs and lows, peaks and valleys, but we have a God who is faithful, and walks with us through it all. May we never lose sight of that promise.

A final written report is required to be submitted to the Endowment Fund Committee no later than December 1st of the year of the grant. The report shall include documentation of the expenditures and completion status of the project.

Feeding hungry people is a core part of our Hope Ministries' mission, and our food services operation is currently experiencing a severe staffing shortage. At this time, we simply do not have the staff we need to meet all our daily meal planning, preparation and serving needs.

We remain committed to providing free meals to all our residents and Hope Café community meal quests, and **we need your help!** Hope Ministries is asking for donations of casseroles:

- **1. Breakfast casseroles** We need casseroles that serve 100 people. The easiest way to assemble 100 servings is to use ten disposable 9×13 pans (feeds 100 people per meal) which are ready to freeze when needed. We hope to have enough breakfast casseroles to serve our residents and community meal guests hot breakfast four times per week.

Entrepreneurship, Food, and Welcoming

In 2006, Ali and her family traveled from Kenya and resettled in the U.S. They found themselves in an unfamiliar place: Iowa. But today, they still call Iowa home, thanks to the community they built and the support they received while resettling in the U.S. LSI Refugee and Immigrant Services helped the family become comfortable and confident living in their new community.

"They taught us to shop, register for school – all the basic needs. Even winter shopping for the lowa weather," Ali says. "They taught us how to get by. It was nice to help us get settled in."

After some time in Iowa, Ali and her husband, Salah, decided they wanted to open a restaurant as successful as the one they had in Kenya. They soon realized how challenging this would be – the biggest obstacle being the financial burden of opening a restaurant in the Des Moines area. After 15 years of never giving up on their goals, they were able to open Gursha Ethiopian Grill.

Opening during a pandemic, when other restaurants in the industry struggled to remain open, has come with its share of obstacles. But thanks to community support, the restaurant is a popular destination in the area.

Ali dreams of one day franchising to other locations. With their continuously growing clientele and delicious food, this goal is not far away.

On December 14, LSI had the honor of welcoming the first families from Afghanistan that LSI is helping to resettle in Iowa. Resettlement takes a community, and we are deeply grateful to you for supporting this work.

December 14th, 2021 Church Council Highlights

The Council met via zoom application at 6:08 PM. Council members attending were Bruce Bergman, Aaron Brandsfield, Susanne Carney, Valerie Culp, Alex Davik, Dave Gronert, Tom McCleary, John Roehrick, Pastor Mike, and Dean Watson. Kevin Krause also attended the meeting

The Council received and reviewed the financial and staff reports.

- The Council was informed that the church received a check from the City of Des Moines, paying in full the claim for sewer backup damage to Msindo Hall.
- Staff concerns still awaiting action: the move toward gender-neutral/family friendly bathrooms across from the library.
- **Financial Report:** The church is on pace to break even for the year pending good Christmas and end-of-year offerings.
- **Budget and Stewardship:** Kevin Krause reported that the stewardship drive is winding down, with overall good response. There are still outstanding pledge cards which hopefully will be turned in soon.
- **2022 Budget:** On behalf of the Finance Committee, Kevin presented the proposed budget for FY 2022. **It was moved, seconded, and passed** to accept this proposed budget and to present it to the Congregation for approval at the Annual Meeting.

It was moved, seconded, and passed to begin the application process for Grace Lutheran Church to become an intern site.

The Nominating Committee report: The Council provided additional names to the Nominating Committee to be contacted as prospective Council candidates.

Pastor Mike announced the altered schedule for Christmas services: December 24th services will be at 4 PM, 6 PM, and 8 PM, with the 4 PM service being streamed. There will be NO SERVICE on December 25th. December 26th will feature an online service from the Synod.

Annual Meeting: The Council designated **January 30, 2022** as the date for the Annual Meeting, with budget forums to be held **January 16th and January 23rd, 2022.** The format (in-person or virtual) to be determined as Covid allows. Perhaps it will be a combination of the two formats.

Next scheduled Council meeting will be January 18th, 2022.

Love your Neighbor: Growing in understanding

This column is place for facts and resources about racial disparities, definitions of terms, and information about current events. We invite you to use this as a starting point to examine your own biases, expand your knowledge, do research, and for discussion.

Ableism: Discrimination of and social prejudice against people with disabilities and/or people who are perceived to be disabled, based on the belief that "typical" abilities are superior. Ableism defines people by their disabilities (real or perceived) and categorizes them as inferior to the non-disabled.


Most people don't use disabled-only parking or seats unless they need them, and don't ask others why they need them - "What's wrong with you?". They don't use words like retarded, dumb, spastic, abnormal, or crazy to describe someone. They don't see disability in others as a 'bad' thing, or a person's most important identifying trait.

But day to day, ableism - often unintentional - is quieter but ever-present, slowly wearing down capable, hard-working people who just happen to be physically or mentally different from others. The damage compounds for those who are disabled *and* from a marginalized population. Learn to be an ally:

- Don't say "you don't *look/sound* disabled" as if that is a compliment.
- Don't minimize another's struggle for your comfort. Give people space to talk about it.
- Don't assume that a physical disability is a product of laziness or lack of care for health.
- Don't say "Wow, you are SO inspirational!" for doing typical things such as having a job, career, family, owning a home while disabled. This devalues a person's hard work and other abilities. Instead, celebrate how hard they work, study, plan, etc.`
- Disabled people can speak for themselves: Always speak directly to the person rather than the caregiver.

Thrivent Action Teams

- Thrivent Action Team funds were used to purchase 7 coats (photo below) and a few pairs of extra mittens.

Thank you to everyone that assisted with the above projects and extra thanks to those that continue to help stock our Little Free Pantry. It certainly is a simple, but very caring ministry of Grace and the neighborhood. It helps meet the need for food and the need to give.

- Don't compare chronic/long term disabilities to a temporary/short term illness or injury you healed from.
- Understand that a chronic illness or major change in ability creates a great amount of grief. You wouldn't suggest someone "just get over/accept it" when a loved one dies, don't do it here either.
- Don't suggest that people with disabilities are 'working the system."
 Disabled people often have to fight to prove they are disabled and often need to keep proving it to keep any benefits and help they receive.
- Understand that physical disabilities often cause anxiety and depression, compounding difficulties.

These are just a few pitfalls to look for. You can look up lists of ableist words to avoid, and other articles to learn more about how to be an ally.
