WELCOME

L: This is the longest night of the year...

Lighting of the Advent Wreath

L: We light the candle of Hope as we await the coming of Jesus, who is our source of hope. **C: Thank you, Lord, for the gift of hope, in our times of emptiness.**

L: We light the candle of Peace, knowing that Jesus is the Prince of Peace.

C: Thank you, Lord, for the gift of peace in our times of uncertainty.

L: We light the candle of Joy, knowing that our comfort and help come from God. **C: Thank you, Lord, for the gift of joy in our times of sadness.**

L: We light the candle of Love, knowing that God is love revealed to us in Jesus Christ. **C: Thank you, Lord, for the gift of love in our times of loneliness.**

L: In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. **C: The Word became flesh and lived among us, full of grace and truth.**

L: In him was life, and that life was the light of all. We light the Christ Candle, knowing that Jesus is our hope, our peace, our joy, and the source of love.

Prayer of Confession

L: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and one another.

C: Generous and gracious God, we look to you for compassion. We know the pain of loss, the confusion of uncertainty, and the fear of the future. Overwhelmed by our burdens, we easily

forget that you never leave us alone and that your steadfast love for us never falters. By coming together, we find assurance and comfort that we do not suffer this longest night alone. Forgive us when we have neglected to reach those whose night is also long. Grant that we may be your healing presence in each other's lives by bringing them your compassion and comfort that will assure us that we are not alone. Amen.

L: By the mercy of God, we are united with Jesus Christ, in whom we are forgiven. We rest now in the peace of Christ and rise in the morning to serve. **Amen.**

Reading

Psalm 57 ¹Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful, for I have taken refuge in you; in the shadow of your wings will I take refuge until this time of trouble has gone by. ²I will call upon the Most High God, the God who is with me to the end. ³O God, you will send from heaven and save me, rebuking those who trample upon me, you will send forth your love and your faithfulness. ⁴I lie in the midst of lions that devour the people; their teeth are spears and arrows, their tongue a sharp sword. ⁵Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, and your glory over all the earth. ⁶They have laid a net for my feet, and I am bowed low; they have dug a pit before me, but have fallen into it themselves. ⁷My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast; I will sing and make melody. ⁸Wake up, my spirit; awake, lute and harp; I myself will waken the dawn. ⁹I will give thanks to you among the peoples, O LORD; I will sing praise to you among the nations. ¹⁰For your steadfast love is greater than the heavens, and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds. ¹¹Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, and your glory over all the earth.

Reading

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
