#### **Finance Report – October Results**

Financial results for October YTD are as follows:

- Income Actual \$317,503, Budget \$359,192, Prior Year \$352,424
- Expenses Actual \$368,450, Budget \$375,783, Prior Year \$347,208
- Net activity Actual (\$50,947), Budget (\$16,592), Prior Year \$5,216

Activity for the year continues to be <u>significantly</u> below budget by \$34K. Offerings were below budget \$42K and expenses were below budget due to Endowment note interest elimination and staffing vacancies. The net activity loss of \$51K is significantly below the prior year income of \$5K.

#### **Grace Little Free Backstock Project receives Grant**

The Immanuel Vision Foundation has approved a grant to help supply the Grace Little Free Pantry Backstock Project. The total amount of the grant is \$7,400.

This is the second year we have received funds for this project from the Immanuel Vision Project – we received \$6,000 in 2022.

Last year Vicar Bunny, and now Grace members Kari Dostalik and Tammy Denton use the funds through the year to purchase bulk items on sale to supplement items donated by the congregation and neighborhood. They are also responsible for submitting the Grant request and project updates to the Foundation. Thank you Kari and Tammy for your work on this!

#### How can YOU help the LFP?

With the rising cost of food and record numbers of people utilizing local food banks, every donation counts. Every box of cereal, fresh produce from a summer garden can help one person or family get through the day without having to choose between rent and food, or medical expenses and food. Hygiene items are expensive, but can make a difference for children at school who might be bullied for poor hygiene, or for an adult being presentable and feeling confident at a job or interview.

- Donate items requested each month.
- Donate money so that our volunteers can continue purchase items in bulk, making the most of sales.
- Help stock the pantry! Volunteers fill the pantry each morning or afternoon, each taking one shift a week. Contact Tammy or Kari for details!

Mosaic stars list suggested gifts from which you may select. Each gift should be worth approximately \$25. LSI asks for \$25 Walmart gift cards. Gifts should be returned, unwrapped, with the star, by Sunday, December 11th.

You may return gifts/cards to the church on Sundays – place your gift beneath the Star Tree in the Gathering Hall—place gift cards in the secure mail slot at the church office. You can drop gifts/cards off at church during office hours—call ahead to arrange. Gift cards can



be mailed to the church or dropped off in the mailbox outside church—postage must be included even if you drop it off.

## Grace Endowment Fund Grants – Apply Today!

The Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is currently accepting applications for grants to be awarded in March 2024.

Established in 1992, the purpose of the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is to promote faithful Christian stewardship by providing a congregational plan to receive grants, gifts, or bequests of money to be used to enhance the total program and mission of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church beyond that supported through regular giving and apart from the general operation of the congregation. No portion of the income generated by the Fund may be used for the annual operating budget of the congregation.

To date, the Grace Endowment Fund has awarded a total of **\$368,318** to **198 projects.** The Endowment Fund committee, comprised of five Grace members, acts as custodian of the fund.

At least 10% of the total income each year must be allocated to community, charitable or church at large needs which are outside of Grace Lutheran Church. Past funded projects include facility improvements at Lutheran Lakeside Camp; Lutheran Services in Iowa initiatives; reusable water filters for at-risk children; backpacks full of useful items for young, low-income, first-time mothers; and more.

No more than 55% of the total distribution may be allocated for capital improvement items at Grace Lutheran Church each year. Past Grace Lutheran funded projects have included landscaping around the Little Free Pantry/Library; improvements to the deck and garden sheds; a walking path to the Little Free Pantry; and more.

Help us spread the word! Reach out to non-profit organizations you are aligned with and encourage them to apply. **Applications are due January 31, 2024**, with grants awarded no later than March 31, 2024.
