Traveling far

There is an African proverb which says "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together." I find myself thinking a lot about this lately. There have been several articles over the years that describe the work of a parish pastor as the "Loneliest Profession." In many ways it is true. There are professional boundaries, and at other times, necessary boundaries. It is difficult to make close friendships because there are other times when you need to function in a professional capacity.

The truth is it can be lonely. This has been my experience through much of my time as a parish pastor. Honestly, the system is set up this way. When I began my time here on March 1st, 2011, there was such excitement about all the things that the "new pastor" would be able to accomplish. There were goals placed before me, and with it, several expectations, both spoken and unspoken. That happens everywhere.

With such expectations, you start out trying to travel alone. It is easier to do it yourself than try to explain the "how" and "why." It is easier to plan things yourself. You feel this incredible pressure to accomplish all of these things, and you go as fast as you can for as long as you can.

In 2020, the global pandemic made this attitude even more prevalent. Most pastors which whom I have spoken felt more like "content machines." There was a need to produce content, continuously, through video and written means. The things we were trained to do fell off to the side, and the pace hastened. We had to travel fast, and much of that was done while being physically distanced from others.

Eventually, you learn the truth of the proverb: "if you want to go far, go together."In recent years, I have learned a lot about what it is to be a pastor. This growth was only possible when I learned that it is important to go together. It is not about how fast we can accomplish things. It is far more important to be present with others. Last year at this time, I could feel burnout approaching. I was not sure if I had much more to give. I felt empty.

I opened up to the Council and others about this. Where I expected judgement and feeling like I was letting people down, instead, I gained travel partners on this journey. In the months since, I have felt



The Mission Action Fund was used to support several local entities during All-ages service project opportunities 2023. This year that has continued with the Little Free Pantry Book Drive held last month (see details on page 3)

End of year gifts were also given to several agencies at the end of 2023. One of those gifts was \$ for Dorothy House:

"Dorothy's House was once a rundown house and a beautiful goal to help survivors of human trafficking in Iowa. Led by our founder, the community helped transform the house into a safe, supportive space for survivors. We opened our doors to residents in January 2016.

Now, we offer a safe place for survivors to live, have their basic needs met and get help removing barriers to their individual healing journeys. Our programming options have evolved to enable us to also help survivors who can't live in our home because of gender, age and other circumstances.

We focus on the unique needs and personal goals of each person who passes through our doors. We find most of our participants are at risk or vulnerable, and likely to continue negative patterns without intervention.

Our assessment tools help identify each participant's support needs. Then they begin our curriculum, Practice Makes Purpose; Turning Your Wounds Into Wisdom, which incorporates foundational lessons around self-care, emotion regulation, beliefs, values, relationships, identity and more."

Mission Action Fund

Fund Goal: The goal of the Mission Action Fund is to be able to respond quickly to needs in the immediate neighborhood and beyond (statewide, nationally, and internationally), and not to be used for the Congregational Budget. This fund is ideally meant to be used in one of two ways.

- Instances where a Grace member is involved in direct or indirect service to others by being engaged in a community or service activity. The intent here is to get Grace members actively involved in Grace's mission and to live a life differently through Christ.
- 2) Instances where a need exists outside of the Grace community.

Eligibility for Funds:

- Local service organizations. Grace members may or may not be directly active in the organization. Organizations that serve the Merle Hay neighborhood would be ideal but not restricted to this geography.
- Service organizations (statewide, nationally or internationally) that service/help others in times of need or crisis.

At LSI, we believe every lowan deserves the independence they need to thrive. LSI's Host Homes is an innovative way LSI is serving adults with disabilities. Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected mentor. This program is built entirely around an individual's goals and interests, and LSI's extensive matching process ensures the mentor and mentee are a great fit.

Take a moment to read the following story from a Host Homes mentee:

"My journey with LSI's Host Homes started in early 2023. I've known my mentor for a few years while he provided hourly services to me. We learned about Host Homes and thought it would be a good fit for us. I moved into my mentor's home where he helps me maintain a daily routine with schoolwork, household tasks, daily living skills, improving independence, and more.

I attend a college nearby and go to classes a few days a week. I am able to navigate the local bus system to access my community to attend classes and visit friends. My mentor is always available to transport me into the community as needed.

This summer, I went on a trip across the country with one of my classes. While on this trip, I was able to maintain my independence with limited support, but I knew my mentor would be available by phone to assist me with my coping skills and problem solving. This trip was a big success for me knowing I had support only a phone call away.

I like LSI's Host Homes Program because my mentor supports me in the way I want to be supported, assists me with some daily tasks I struggle with, and understands me."

Women's Basketball NCAA Fundraiser 2024 The Annual NCAA Basketball Tournament is back, with an exciting change this year!

We will be following the WOMEN'S Bracket for our fundraiser again this year.

Selection happens on Sunday, March 17th. Are you feeling lucky? Local and regional charities hope so! We will hold the church pool again this year. There will be a \$5 entry fee and the winner will choose which charity



will receive the pool monies. Last year, Carol Woodruff won and was able to give Brenda Mann won and was able to give the \$120 pool to the ALS Association of Iowa in honor of Connie Heuton. So far, we have given away a total of over \$2000 through this annual charity!

To enter simply fill out a bracket and turn it in to the church office between Sunday, March 17th and 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 21st with the \$5 entry fee. You should also note your chosen charity when you turn in the bracket. With no clear favorite to win this year, we will again use a scoring system with added points for the Final Four to keep things exciting. The "First Four" games will not be included. Those correctly predicting that a First Four team wins in the round of 64, even if the wrong First Four team, will receive the point. Then the round of 64 teams will be worth 1 point each with bonus points for upsets (difference between seeds). Round of 32 will be worth 2 points, round of 16 will be worth 4 points each. The following rounds will be worth 6 points, 10 points, and then 15 points for the correct Champion.

Hello Grace Lutheran Church - Des Moines:

I wanted to thank you for your generous contributions in 2023. Thanks to gifts like yours, our ministry was able to make a big impact with youth, families, individuals, and congregations that we serve. Here are some of the exciting things we were able to accomplish.

- Camp served 543 campers, 26 church leaders, 40 staff, 4 mission trips, and over 100 individual volunteers.
 51% of our campers did not have a home church.
- Our hospitality ministry welcomed over 6,000 guest groups, 16 weddings, **1,800 field trip students**, 4-disc golf tournaments, and hundreds on our trails for walking and cross-country skiing.

• Onsite we were able to **renovate the main campfire**, put in new basketball hoops, add new pumps to the pool, make the **shower houses private**, paint the entrance signs, and add a mural to the rec shed. We planted 35 mature trees, sealed dozens of picnic tables and benches, painted Jerusalem, got a new 6 passenger golf cart, added sand and picnic tables to the waterfront for a beach, and added **new elements to our playground**.
