Psalms

When I dive into the Psalms, I find myself mesmerized by the scope of topics. At a recent Bible Study led by Bob Merkley, we dove into Psalms 136 and 137. The first of this is an example of a repetitive mantra speaking of the steadfastness of God's love and mercy. Then, Psalm 137 voices the worst of humanity, wishing the children of their enemies be put to death. It is not a comfortable text. In fact, it often makes me physically nauseous when reading it. Yet, it is there for us to read.

As we discussed the texts, Vicar Jesse pointed out that nothing is beyond the scope of what God can handle. What she said is true. God asks us to be authentic, to be true to ourselves. God does not ask us to act like a follower of Christ. God asks us to bring ourselves into the presence of God, hurts and all. Our journey is not about achieving perfection. It is about being present.

The Psalms cover the whole of the human experience. There is nothing that is off limits. They range from unbridled praise to the depths of 137, and everything in between. There are Psalms of personal lament, or communal lament. There are Psalms for the teaching of theology, and others of praise. It is all in there. That is part of what makes the Book of Psalms so powerful. It is all in there.

We will be diving into the Psalms together during worship starting on July 28th. This is part of a shift to the Narrative Lectionary for the upcoming year. We will spend 6 weeks in the Psalms and then we will journey through the whole of the Bible from September until mid-June. This will start in Genesis and continue through the whole of the Bible, using one text each week.

As we prepare for the journey through Scripture, it seems wise to start with the Psalms. These Psalms are split into three categories based on the work of Dr. Walter Brueggemann; Psalms of Orientation, Psalms of Disorientation, and Psalms of Reorientation. These categories tell the tale of the people of God throughout the Bible and beyond. There are times when we feel connected to God, where we feel like we have the right orientation. There are times when we become more disconnected with God and start to lose our orientation. There are also times when we find our way back to God.

July Little Free Pantry Request of the Month: Cereal, Pancake, or Muffin mixes

Donate cereal, pancake or muffin mixes this month or give to the Little Free Pantry through the <u>GIVE</u> page where funds will be used to purchase items to stock the pantry.

You can also order items from the <u>Amazon Grace Wish List</u>, which will be shipped directly to the church. Thank you for your donations.

Our Little Free Pantry has been a much-needed resource for many families in our community. Each week, we have volunteers who place items in the pantry every day of the week, and twice on Mondays and Tuesdays. They pull 40 - 50 items from our pantry backstock room during each visit to place in the Little Free Pantry, located outside on 52nd Street, near the garden. Our funding for this mission has been supported through congregational member dollar contributions and a grant from the Immanuel Vision Foundation (for the past two years). This year, we received \$7,400 in grant money. Through all of these contributions, we have been able to have a monthly budget of \$937 to go shopping with to fill the backstock room. How much does this buy? Here is a recap of a recent shopping trip:

48 jars of peanut butter	72 cans of tomato sauce	36 quarts of Almond milk
35 boxes of cereal	36 cans of pasta meals	48 packages of Pop Tarts
100 packets of instant oatmeal	48 boxes of dry pasta	36 NutriGrain bars
48 packets of instant grits	24 bags of rice	60 snack size boxes of raisins
70 cans of tuna	24 boxes of rice mixes	594 diapers (multiple sizes)
108 cans of beans (Kidney, Garbanzo, Black)	36 packages of instant mashed potatoes	288 tampons
12 bags of dry Pinto beans	72 boxes of macaroni & cheese	45 rolls of toilet paper
120 cans of vegetables (green beans, corn, peas)	120 packages of ramen noodles	40 bars of soap

In addition to these items, we are grateful to receive food donations from our <u>Amazon Grace Wish</u> <u>List</u> and items placed in the wagon located in the entryway.



Listening to Scripture with the "Ear of your heart"

A recurring aspect of a contemplative rhythm is moving from an 'either/or' to a 'both/and' approach to any number of things, including the way we engage with scripture. We're familiar with the important discipline of studying a text to search out the historical context, the meaning of the words in the original language, and the author's intention. This puts our intellect to good, challenging, fruitful, work.



And there is an ancient Christian practice which seeks to engage scripture in a personal and immediate way, letting it be a portal for a closer relationship with God. We could call it reflective reading or listening with the 'ear of our hearts'. It's 'official' name is Lectio Divina ('divine reading'), though I do better with simpler words that sound like something ordinary people like me can do. This practice benefits from a basic understanding of the text, but is not dependent on it or limited by it. It brings our heart online as we attend to our own inner stirrings.

We listen for a word or phrase which resonates in us in this present moment. We may read a favorite passage and find ourself drawn not so much to what we have loved over the years, but to something hiding there that we've not noticed before! Let the word or phrase that 'speaks to you' draw you into communion with the Holy One, exactly as you are in the present moment.

Contemplative Outreach offers these steps (https://www.contemplativeoutreach.org/lectio-divina-contemplation/)

- 1. Read a passage listening with the "ear of your heart." What word or phrase captures your attention? Repeat it gently.
- 2. Reflect on and relish the words. Be attentive to what speaks to your heart.
- 3. As listening deepens, allow responses to arise spontaneously—praise, thanksgiving, questions, petitions
- 4. Simply "be with" God's presence as you open to deeper meanings of the Word of God for you.

This is one piece of the Preparation for Worship gathering at 8:30 on Sunday mornings. We read one of the scripture passages we will hear or a stanza of a hymn we will sing, with the intention of being more fully present to the movement of God's Spirit within and among us as we gather. In this way we seek to hold our whole worshiping community in prayer.

Even if you can't join us at 8:30, you can use the minutes before worship to reflectively read the texts for the day. May we all be blessed as we bring more and more of ourselves to our time together!

We have begun offering a new prayerful opportunity for members of the congregation to center and prepare for worship.

When: Sunday mornings, 8:30 a.m.

Where: The Upper Room.

What to expect: A prayer, a short Centering-Prayer sit, and a reflective reading of the lyrics for one of the day's hymns. The practice will end with the chanting of a Psalm before heading down to the Sanctuary for worship.

- 1. Call to order. Dinner provided by Greg Boeschen
- 2. Introductions
- 3. Devotions The God Who is Here, Chapter 3
- 4. Adoption of Agenda Carter moved, Jenny seconded, agenda approved.
- 5. Approval of Minutes Carter moved, Brian seconded, minutes approved.
- 6. "Ideas that will get you fired:" what about selling the church property or "right-sizing" the space to focus on mission?
- 7. Staff Reports office staff working on reviewing and organizing files. Files will be removed from the storage room downstairs and divided into "keep" or "shred" using extra classrooms for staging. Also still working on updating the website.

 - d. Amp and Sound System Updates new amp was installed. Fine tuning the webcast parameters.
 - e. Status of water issues more water in the quilt room. Need to have a plumber locate the cleanout and the sewer company can do the cleaning to help prevent reoccurrence.
 - f. Investing reserves, start with CDs, need to set up guidelines and responsible persons in a policy for the finance committee.
 - g. Communication of sex offender accountability policy and disclosure letter. Final versions were reviewed and will be mailed out later this week.
 - h. Constitution & Bylaws update finalizing last updates. Goal to have Synod review by the end of summer.
 - HVAC quotes for Todd's house reviewed. Kevin moved to proceed with Dayton Quote for replacement systems for \$11,706 coming from capital fund. Carter seconded. Motion approved.

10. New Business

- a. Masonry repairs Several areas on roof need masonry repairs that Wood Roofing cannot do. Contacting companies and waiting on quotes etc.
- Conditional travel expenses for Bunny's ordination in August. Pastor is part of the ordination service so will be traveling to Houston. Greg moved that lodging expenses be covered by professional education expense line item. Tom seconded. Motion approved.
