## Longest Night Worship at Immanuel United Methodist Church

In the past few years we have held a Longest Night Worship here at Grace in recognition of that need. This year, Contemplative Outreach of Central Iowa is teaming with Immanuel United Methodist Church — just down the street from Grace — to provide an evening worship option on Saturday, December 21.

This service will share the beautiful songs and prayers of Taizè to move with hope into the darkness of the Winter Solstice. Readings during worship will feature writings of or about St. John of the Cross and the Dark Night of the Soul. We lean into the darkness of this night for healing, grace and transformation.

During the day prior to the Taizè service, there will be 7 shared periods of prayer with Psalms of lament on the Winter Solstice. From their website:

You are invited to join our contemplative community for shared periods of prayer with Psalms of Lament on the Winter Solstice. We will gather in the newly remodeled chapel space at Immanuel UMC. Come in the doors at the covered drive and go upstairs, following the hall to the left. Prayer periods will last about 30 minutes, including brief readings before and after Centering Prayer. You are welcome to remain in the building for extended periods of prayer and reflection.

- 7 a.m. Psalm 13 How Long will this pain go on?
- 9 a.m. Psalm 12 I call out to You
- 11 a.m. Psalm 25 I lift my heart to You
- Noon Psalm 44 It is You, God, who released us from our torment.
- 1 p.m. Psalm 22 My God, My God, why?
- 3 p.m. Psalm 85 Rescue is near... justice and peace have been kissed.
- 5 p.m. Psalm 77 You stand beside us as we walk through our fears to the path of wholeness and love.

## Step into the new year with a walking meditation Saturday, January 11 from 9:00-3:00 and Sunday, January 12 from 10:00-noon

Labyrinth walking is an ancient practice used by many faiths for centering, contemplation, and prayer. Entering the serpentine path of a labyrinth, you stroll while quieting your mind and focusing on a spiritual question or prayer, walking first toward the center and then out again. There is no right or wrong way do this. Often walkers set an intention, sometimes with the sense of letting go of what it is time to shed on the walk in, opening oneself to inspiration or guidance in the



center, and then emerging back into life, renewed, refreshed, ready to live into the next unfolding steps of life. An excellent way indeed to start a new year.

While one walks in the silence of their heart, it can also be meaningful to walk with others who are bringing their own silent focus. Saturday you will also have an opportunity to participate in Group walks which will begin at 10:00, noon and 2:00. You are invited to meditate, journal or pray before or after your walk.

Plans are in the works to convert what was the daycare playground into an accessible community labyrinth and prayer garden. After worship on January 12 we will update the congregation on our progress and invite you to experience this ancient way of prayer walking an indoor labyrinth set up in Grace Hall.

## **Little Free Pantry Drive**

During the month of December, we are having a funding drive for our Little Free Pantry.

In 2019, the Little Free Pantry ("LFP") was erected to help with the rising food insecurity. In 2022, the LFP backstock room was created to have an inventory of food. *On average, we have purchased \$923 on food and personal care items monthly this year.* We have a team of volunteers who stock the LFP with 50+ items 1-2 times a day. The pantry provides sustenance for a growing need in the area where nearly 72% of students at the neighborhood elementary school qualify for "free & reduced lunch". Typically, the pantry is empty when the volunteers arrive to refill each day. On occasion, the volunteers get to meet some of the people using the pantry who take what they need to help supplement a meal for a day or two. We also know that there are residents in the neighborhood who regularly put food in the pantry.

We are asking for additional contributions during this holiday season to build up our funds for the Little Free Pantry. You can also provide donations online through the <u>GIVE</u> page\* or by check payable to Grace Lutheran Church designated for "Little Free Pantry".

#### **Grace Endowment Fund**

Endowment grants are awarded each year to groups both inside and outside of Grace. A certain percentage of the funds given each year must be awarded to community groups outside of the Grace community, so please share and promote this opportunity widely.

#### Finance Report – November Results

Financial results for November YTD are as follows:

- Income Actual \$414,750, Budget \$378,013, Prior Year \$362,054
- Expenses Actual \$425,482, Budget \$383,067, Prior Year \$398,995
- Net activity Actual (\$10,732), Budget (\$5,054), Prior Year (\$36,941)

Results are great considering some large expenses. Thanks to everyone who has made this happen. Activity is \$6K behind budget, including \$37K of unbudgeted roof repair work, \$16K of HVAC repairs and \$23K of drainage work.

The December Council report will be included as part of the Annual Report, which will be available in Mid-January. You are always welcome to request the minutes from Council.
