


Gathering Hymn



Reading Notes:

(Acts) The apostles were gathered in a house on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came to fill the place and enabled them to speak in other lanquages. (Galatians) Those who lived under the law are now redeemed by Christ who set them free from slavery under the spiritual forces. And as they receive the Spirit of Christ who calls God

"Abba, Father," they

are no longer slaves but children of God.

Reading: Acts 2:1-4; Galatians 4:1-7

^{2:1}When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

^{4:1}My point is this: heirs, as long as they are minors, are no better than slaves, though they are the owners of all the property; ²but they remain under guardians and trustees until the date set by the father. ³So with us; while we were minors, we were enslaved to the elemental spirits of the world. ⁴But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. ⁶And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" ⁷So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.
